APPROVAL FOR EXECUTIVE STAFF AND BOARD MEMBERS TO ATTEND 93RD NFHS SUMMER CONFERENCE Commissioner Cox requested permission for the executive staff and the Board of Directors to attend the annual meeting of the National Federation of State High School Associations, July 7-11, 2012. A motion to approve this request was made by Jim Diagostino; seconded by Geoff Penrod; motion passed 17-0.

FOOTBALL COACHES PROPOSAL

Jeff Adamson, Ryan Gallogly, Dave Land, and Reed May, representing the Indiana Football Coaches Association presented their proposals to the IHSAA Executive Committee.

- 1. Add a 6th class to the tournament series.
- 2. Implementing a tradition factor to the tournament series.
- 3. Seed teams at the sectional level.

Proposals 1 & 2 will be placed on the agenda for the annual meeting in May, since it requires a By-Law change. Proposal 3 will be placed on the March Executive Committee meeting agenda for action.

SOCCER COACHES PROPOSAL

Rollie Clements, Mikki Matteson and Greg Mauch, representing the Indiana Soccer Coaches Association, presented their proposals to the IHSAA Executive Committee.

- 1. Change the "Caution Accumulation Rule" for Tournament play to the following:
 Players/Coaches start with a "clean slate" on Accumulated Cautions for the IHSAA Tournament. Players/Coaches that accumulate a 3rd Caution during the Tournament would receive a one match suspension. Players/Coaches who receive two additional Cautions would be suspended for an additional match.
- 2. Also relates to the "Caution Accumulation Policy" for coaches who play a student-athlete in violation of the policy. The following is suggested. Coaches who allow a student-athlete to participate in a contest in violation of the "Caution Accumulation Policy" will be suspended for one match. Coaches who allow a student-athlete to participate in a contest in violation of the "Caution Accumulation Policy" will be suspended for one match.
- 3. #1 Junior Varsity Games Many schools, due to facility restrictions (Lack of lighting) have difficulty completing JV games. Over 72% of the membership supported a proposal to allow JV games to be played with a 'running clock'.
- 4 I.H.S.A.A. Tournament Officials When asked about assignment of Tournament Officials 72.6% expressed concerns. Enforcing the "Scratch List" was mentioned by 50.8% and assigning officials as crews was suggested by 21.8%

Action will be taken at the March Executive Committee meeting on proposals two and four. Proposal one and three will be placed on the agenda for the annual meeting in May, since it requires a By-Law change.

Assistant Commissioner Searcy presented preliminary plans for the 2012 IHSAA Student Leadership Conference scheduled for June 19, 2012, at Plainfield High School. Information will be disseminated to the membership in March.

BUILDING RENOVATION REPORT

Commissioner Cox presented a progress report on the building renovation project.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Commissioner Cox reported on the progress of Senate Bill 236. Eleven town meetings will be conducted across the state to gather fan perspective of class basketball.

PENALTIES ASSESSED

The following penalties were assessed for various violations of the IHSAA By-Laws:

Bowman Leadership Academy

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rules 3-6 and 8.1 (*Multiple players left bench area during altercation in boys' varsity basketball game – PROBATION*)

- 1. The Thea Bowman Leadership Academy Boys' Basketball program is placed on probation through the conclusion of the 2012-13 winter season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
- 2. The suspensions issued by Thea Bowman Leadership Academy and already served by student athletes of the boys' basketball team are accepted by the IHSAA as immediate sanctions imposed on offending individuals.
- 3. The contest was stopped during the third quarter and was never restarted. This contest shall be forfeited by Thea Bowman Academy and be reflected as a loss on the boys' basketball record for the 2011-12 season.
- 4. The administration of Thea Bowman Leadership Academy shall continue to work with the boys' basketball program to insure acts of this nature are eliminated with a focus on proper behaviors in an education based athletic setting.

Crothersville High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' basketball player participated in several JV games without an approved transfer report on file*)

- 1. The Crothersville High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
- 2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in a contest at their new school.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the contests in which the ineligible player participated shall be forfeited if Crothersville was victorious. Crothersville High School shall notify all opponents of this violation.

Fort Wayne Canterbury High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (Boys' swimmer participated in several swim meets without an approved transfer report on file)

- 1. The Fort Wayne Canterbury High School boys' swimming program is issued a warning.
- 2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in a contest at their new school.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the scores of the meets the ineligible student participated in shall be recalculated to remove all points acquired by the ineligible athlete. Fort Wayne Canterbury High School is instructed to inform all schools involved of this violation and the refigured scores.

Fort Wavne South Side High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 9-13 (Boys' basketball player participated in feeder middle school open facility on Sunday)

- 1. The Fort Wayne South Side High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
- 2. Coach Mike Novell is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. It is imperative that all coaches review the provisions of the IHSAA by-laws with all assistant volunteer coaches and students regarding both participation rules and Sunday activities.

Indianapolis Arlington High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-6 and 8.1 (*Multiple players engage in an altercation during a girls' varsity basketball game – PROBATION*)

- 1. The Indianapolis Arlington girls' basketball program is placed on probation through the conclusion of the 2012-13 winter season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
- The suspensions already served by student athletes of the girls' basketball team are accepted by the IHSAA as immediate sanctions imposed on offending individuals.
- 3. The contest was stopped during the fourth quarter and was never restarted. This contest shall be forfeited by Indianapolis Arlington and be reflected as a loss on the girls' basketball record for the 2011-12 season.

- 4. Due to the ejections incurred in the contest, Indianapolis Arlington failed to have enough eligible players for the IHSAA girls' basketball sectional contest against Indianapolis Bishop Chatard and forfeited said contest. Due to this forfeiture and failure to field a team in the sectional, Indianapolis Arlington shall not share in the net proceeds from the sectional
- 5. The administration of Indianapolis Arlington shall continue to work with the girls' basketball program to insure acts of this nature are eliminated with a focus on proper behaviors in an education based athletic setting.

Indianapolis Arsenal Technical High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Two wrestlers participated in an invitational meet while academically ineligible*)

- The Indianapolis Arsenal Technical High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
- 2. The student athletes involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until they meet the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
- In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Indianapolis Arsenal Technical High School shall notify Corydon Central High School of this violation. Any points scored in competition by the ineligible athletes shall be vacated and team scores for this event recalculated.

Indianapolis Bishop Chatard High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Wrestler participated in several meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

- 1. The Indianapolis Bishop Chatard High School wrestling program is issued a warning.
- 2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in a contest at their new school.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the scores of the meets the ineligible student participated in shall be recalculated to remove all points acquired by the ineligible athlete. Indianapolis Bishop Chatard High School is instructed to inform all schools involved of this violation and the refigured scores.

Indianapolis Manual High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-6 and 8.1 ((Multiple players engage in an altercation during a girls' varsity basketball game – PROBATION)

- 1. The Indianapolis Manual girls' basketball program is placed on probation through the conclusion of the 2012-13 winter season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
- The suspensions already served by student athletes of the girls' basketball team are accepted by the IHSAA as immediate sanctions imposed on offending individuals.
- 3. The contest was stopped during the fourth quarter and was never restarted. This contest shall be forfeited by Indianapolis Manual and be reflected as a loss on the girls' basketball record for the 2011-12 season.
- 4. The administration of Indianapolis Manual shall continue to work with the girls' basketball program to insure acts of this nature are eliminated with a focus on proper behaviors in an education based athletic setting.

Medora High Schools

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (Boys' basketball player participated in a game while academically ineligible)

- 1. The Medora High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
- 2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until he meets the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Medora High School shall notify Indiana School for the Deaf of this violation and the contest shall be forfeited if Medora was victorious.

Mitchell High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-2.2 (Four volleyball players participated together on a non-school volleyball team)

- 1. The Mitchell High School girls' volleyball program is issued a warning.
- 2. The student athletes involved in this violation shall be suspended from participation in one girls' volleyball game at the start of the 2012-13 season. It is the school's prerogative to stagger these suspensions over the first three games of the season.

Muncie Central High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Gymnast participated in a JV meet without an approved transfer report on file*)

- 1. The Muncie Central girls' gymnastics program is issued a warning.
- 2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in a contest at their new school.

3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the scores of the meets the ineligible student participated in shall be recalculated to remove all points acquired by the ineligible athlete. Muncie Central High School is instructed to inform all schools Marion High School of this violation and the refigured scores.

North Knox High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 & Rule 3-9 (Female softball player and cross country runner participated without an approved transfer report on file and participated as a fifth year student)

- 1. The North Knox High School softball program and girls' cross country are issued a warning.
- 2. It is absolutely mandatory that the "IHSAA Transfer Report" be submitted and acted upon by the Association prior to a student being allowed to participate in a contest at their new school.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the regular softball season contests where the ineligible athlete participated shall be forfeited. North Knox High School shall notify all schools in contests where North Knox was victorious of this violation and said forfeitures.
- 4. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, the scores of the regular season cross country meets the ineligible student participated in shall be recalculated to remove all points acquired by the ineligible athlete. North Knox High School is instructed to inform all schools of this violation, the refigured scores and the final results. In review of the IHSAA girls cross country regional results, the student was not in a scoring position for North Knox High School therefore her disqualification in this event will not affect the final team scores.

Salem High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' swimmer participated in a meet while academically ineligible*)

- 1. The Salem High School girls' swimming program is issued a warning.
- 2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until she meet the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, Salem High School shall notify Corydon Central High School of this violation. Any points scored in competition by the ineligible athlete shall be vacated and team scores for this event recalculated.

South Bend Riley High School

Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' basketball player participated in a varsity contest while academically ineligible*)

- 1. The South Bend Riley High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
- 2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible for further competition until she meet the minimum standards for academic eligibility.
- 3. In accordance with Rule 3-9 of the IHSAA By-Laws, South Bend Riley High School shall notify Warsaw High School of this violation and the contest shall be forfeited if South Bend Riley was victorious.
