To the Indiana High School Athletic Association

By C. V. HAWORTH

During the last two years the I. H. S. A. A. has had a phenomenal growth. The advantages which are to be derived from belonging to the association are readily recognized, and only those who take no interest in athletic contests of any kind, together with those who wish to play independently, do not seek admission into it. The small high schools find that they have the same equity, and are given the same opportuni ies to participate in all athletic activities as the larger schools of the state. This has been proven repeatedly, when small high schools have been the victors in the state meets.

That high school athletics has come to stay is accepted. The question is one of control and direction of it. That question is vital. Shall athletics be held up to the boys as the all important and only desirable thing to be sought after, or shall athletics be a means to an end?

The pioneer days of this organization were trying ones; oftentimes much that was unsportsmanlike was tolerated because it was impossible to secure the cooperation of a sufficient number of schools to correct the evil. By degrees it was discovered that it was much easier to direct athletics where all were banded together in a common organization and played according to rule than it was when each school was a law unto itself. Now many of the objectionable features have been eliminated from school contests and practically all school men believe that athletics is an asset of a school rather than a detriment. Consequently, new schools are being admitted every year, and the association has grown to be a big organization with a membership of 387 schools.

To keep the machinery of this organization intact necessarily entails a great amount of labor on the part of the Permanent Secretary, whose business it is to keep all the schools informed of all the different athletic activities, to answer any and all letters which may be directed to him, on any subject pertaining to the organization. Just for a moment, consider the amount of time required to read and digest the contents of all the protests, to answer innumerable questions, decide questions of law, determine the eligibility of players, and a 'thousand and one' other questions which arise on every hand. Consider the time it takes to prepare and mail all the printed matter

that is sent to schools. It is almost impossible for any school man, who has the burden of attending to all his work, to do his school and association work equally well. It is a work worth doing, and it should be done well. This difficulty will have to be met, and it is now time for the members of this organization to begin to make plans to meet this emergency. Some provision must be made to relieve the Permanent Secretary of some of his duties, which have grown too burdensome; either he must be given the power to employ during the school year some competent assistant, who can take charge of all the clerical work; or some one must be employed who can give all his time to the work of the association. Relief must come, but it must come in a way that will not lower the high standard of athletics which has already been attained, nor must the change in any way lower the efficiency of the organization.

In order to make this change, the school men of the state should give it their very best thought and attention, so that some plan may be worked out for a greater and stronger association. But, in any event, there must be no step backward from the position taken by the founders of this organization, who so wisely planned that the basic principal of this institution should be cooperation and fair play.



BASKET BALL,

During the season of 1914-15 Basket Ball was played in more schools than ever in the previous history of the Y. H. S. A. A. By dividing the State into fourteen sections containing 155 schools, enthusiasm and interest in the game and in the Association spread all over the State. It is safe to say that more and better Basket Ball was played in the High Schools of Indiana last year than has ever been played in the State. For the most part the game was kept clean and wrangling was not prevalent. Our ideals of the game and its management are being lifted and the work of officials is of a superior type than formerly. Official contracts were used in nearly all schools and this one item removed many of the protests which usually arise.

The Sectional Tourneys were handled well and the officials were satisfactory in most places. The Principals offered excellent cooperation at all times. Without exception the cities holding tourneys asked for the tourney again. The difficulty of securing centers was a big one due to the fact that sectional tourneys were new; but the success of the tourneys removed this difficulty forever.

The final tourney was a good one and Indiana University, as usual, proved herself an excellent host. There seemed to be little doubt in the minds of the spectators that the best team won the final tourney. The management of the tourney, the work of the officials and the conduct of the High School students were commendable in every way.

As usual some mistakes were made and the Board intends to profit by them in the future. The location of some of the centers was not the best but centers had to be at places where the tourneys were wanted and where support was promised. A few of the officials proved unsatisfactory and the work of all is known by the Board. Some of the schedules were not made as well as they might have been although all were drawn by lot. The time of playing offered the most difficulty. This can easily be corrected.

Taking the scheme, all in all, however, it was a tremendous success and future tourneys will eliminate and correct the defects. Cleaner and better managed High School Athletics is not to be found in the United States than is found in Indiana. The material which follows gives in detail information regarding the tourneys.




SECTIONAL TOURNEYS MARCH 5 AND 6

The following bases were used in selecting centers: (1) Location—geographical and with reference to schools desiring to participate. (2) Railway and Interurban facilities. (3) General conditions—attitude of local authorities, floors, entertaining facilities, etc.


Schools have been assigned by Counties with the intention of having about the same number in each Tourney. The following scheme gives the Centers and also the Counties assigned to each Center. The name of your county locates your center. The Board reserves the right to re-adjust the scheme if unforseen conditions make it advisable and necessary. The numbers indicate the schools from each County that have expressed their desire to enter.

Management—The management of these Tourneys rests solely with the Board of Control. Local arrangements have been delegated to the Center Principals. Two officials for each Tourney will be selected by the Board and none but fair, disinterested and competent men will be chosen. All schedules of Hours, Floors, Teams and Officials will be made out and printed by the Board. These schedules will be made by lot and no changes will be made in them.

Open Contest—These Tourneys are open to all members of the Association, irrespective of their season's record.

Protests -All protests against teams or individuals must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before February 24, at 11:00 a.m. Protests should be accompanied by evidence.

Entertainment—Teams are limited to seven men, and no more can be certified to. The Center Principals have contracted with the Board to entertain eight men (which MUST include the faculty manager) from each competing school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 7 a. m. Friday, March 5, and continue if necessary, to 8 a. m., Sunday, March 7. Printed schedules will be sent to each competing school in plenty of time to arrange for making the trip, etc. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Expenses—Traveling will be at the expense of the competing schools. An entrance fee of \$3.50 for each team must accompany the entry blank, \$3.00 of which will be returnable to the Principal whose team actually participates in the Tourney, and 50 cents to be retained by the I. H. S. A. A., for Tourney expenses.

Privileges—All competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty manager from each team, are to be admitted free to all games.

Eligibility—The eligibility of each player must be certified to by the Principal of the school sending the team. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. Entries will close Tuesday, February 23. This means that they must be in the hands of the Permanent Secretary complete in every detail on that date.

Admission Fee —The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one (1) dollar for season tickets and no more shall be received for said tickets. No more tickets shall be sold than the capacity of the house will justify.

Prizes—No prizes of any kind are to be awarded to any school or individual.

Distribution of Tickets—An equitable distribution of tickets shall be made among the competing schools based on distance, enrollment in High School, and probable attendance from the competing schools. Any unfair methods or prices higher than those mentioned in this announcement should be reported to the Board of Control with evidence.

Warnings—Entries close Tuesday, February 23, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entrance fee of \$3.50 must accompany each entry blank. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks and money to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana. All data must be given.

FINAL TOURNEY, BLOOMINGTON, MARCH 12 AND 13.

Entrants—The winning teams of the Sectional Tourneys shall constitute the participants in the final Tourney.

Entries—Teams are limited to seven men and no more can be certified to. These teams may or may not be made up of the same men that participated in the Sectional Tourneys. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. These are due in the hands of the Permanent Secretary on Tuesday, March 9, complete in every detail. One entry fee covers both the Sectional and Final Tourneys.

Entertainment—Indiana University has contracted with the Board to entertain eight men (which MUST include the faculty manager) from each school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 8 p. m. Thursday, March 11, and continue, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday, March 14. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Admission Fee—The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and fifty (50) cents for season tickets.

Warnings—Entries are due Tuesday, March 9, and cannot be changed afterwards. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana. All data must be given. The management, protests, expenses, and privileges will be governed according to the regulations pertaining to the Sectional Tourneys.

Prizes—Indiana University will award the winning school a shield or similar trophy, and each member of its team an individual trophy. No other prizes shall be awarded.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT.

The following articles of agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association Board of Control through A. L. Trester,

Permanent Secretary, and

SECTION I

The dates of the Indiana High School Basket Ball Tourneys shall be Friday and Saturday, March 5 and 6, 1915.

SECTION II

The State High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the High School representative with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams on or before Saturday, February 27.

SECTION III

The High School representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of eight men which shall include one Faculty Manager for each team between the hours of 7 A. M. Friday, March 5 and 8 A. M. Sunday, March 7. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control.

SECTION IV

The High School representative shall provide tickets, door men, ushers, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, basket balls, and all necessary equipment for the games. No prizes whatever are to be given.

SECTION V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Tourney.

SECTION VI


The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the officials for the games not included in Section IV.

SECTION VII

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single game tickets and fifty (50) cents for season tickets.

SECTION VIII

The High School representative shall pay to A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, the expenses of the officials mentioned in Section VI and the cost of printing five hundred schedules for the Tourney. All other receipts shall belong to the High School conducting the Tourney. A. L. Trester will furnish the High School representative with a statement covering these expenses.

SECTION IX

The details of all Tourneys such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc. are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

SECTION X

The High School under whose auspices the Tourney is held promises hearty cooperation with the State Board of Control and the State Board of Control promises as much to the High School conducting the Tourney.

SECTION XI

The State Board of Control shall manage all Tourneys, and the High Schools are to work under this direction.

SECTION XII

The High School representative shall send by telegram the name of the winning school to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana as soon as the Tournament is completed. The High School representative shall also send to A. L. Trester on or before Thursday, March 11 the complete scores of all games as well as copies of the local papers having comments upon the Tourney. A check covering the expenses of officials and the printing of the schedules shall be sent upon this date.

Tourneys will be held at Anderson, Bedford, Bluffton, Brazil, Crawfordsville, Evansville, Franklin, Hammond, Kokomo, Lafayette, Lebanon, Richmond, Rochester and Seymour.

Teams must be on floor as scheduled under penalty of forfeiture of game.

No changes will be made in the schedule, and no substitutions of nonentered players will be permitted.

The official entry list will be in the hands of the Principal at all times, and shall constitute final evidence in all cases. Players will be subject to identification at any time.

Teams are limited to seven men and must be in charge of a Faculty manager, who will be held responsible for the students and their conduct.

Spalding's Official Basket Ball Guide shall be the official rules of all Tourneys,

The officials have been assigned by the Board and no changes will be made. Their decisions will be final.

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be not more than 25 cents for single session tickets and \$1.00 for season tickets.

The winning team in each Tourney will participate in the Final Tourney at Bloomington March 12 and 13. Entry blanks are due on Tuesday, March 9, complete in every detail.

Entertainment, board and lodging, for eight men from each competing school begins, if necessary, at 7 a. m. Friday and continues, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday. Kindly ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Traveling expenses are to be paid by the competing schools.

Eight complimentary tickets will be issued to each Faculty manager, admitting to all games. Managers should call for these upon arrival. These tickets are not transferable.

Communications with the Board during the Tourneys should be carried on through A. L. Trester. If you observe this, business will be expedited.

Alexandria, Indiana, February 2, 1915.

ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary and U. H. Smith, representing Indiana University.

SECTION I

The date of the Indiana High School Basket Ball Tourney shall be March 12 and 13 at Bloomington, Indiana on the University floors.

SECTION II

The High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary shall furnish U. H. Smith with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams on or before Wednesday, March 10.

SECTION III

U. H. Smith shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams, including one rubber and one faculty manager for each team, between the hours of 8 P. M. Thursday, March 11, and 8 A. M. Sunday, March 14.

SECTION IV

The Indiana University representative shall provide tickets, gate men, announcers, scorers, time keepers, judges, and necessary equipment for the Tourney. He shall further provide a suitable shield for the school winning the Tourney and badges for the individual members of the winning team.

SECTION V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the University representative who shall issue them to the representatives of the Press, the University officials, and to the helping students. The men on the competing teams with one rubber and one faculty manager for each team shall be admitted free to the Tourney. The members of the Board of Control and the Permanent Secretary shall be furnished with official badges and reserved seats.

SECTION VI

The High School Board of Control shall choose the officials other than those mentioned in Section IV.

SECTION VII

The admission fee shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and fifty (50) cents for season tickets.

SECTION VIII

The University representative, U. H. Smith, shall pay to the Treasurer of the High School Board of Control, J. H. Shock, one hundred (100) dollars at the close of the Tourney. If there should be a balance in the hands of the University representative at the end of the Tourney after all expenses have been paid this balance shall be divided on the basis of 25% to the Board of Control and 75% to the University.

SECTION IX

Indiana University shall pay the two officials chosen by the Board of Control and also expenses of the Board of Control incurred on account of the Tourney. Expense account to be submitted to Treasurer of Boosters Club at time of settlement.

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be not more than 25 cents for single session tickets and 75 cents for season tickets.

The winning team in this Tourney will be considered the Champion Basket Ball team in the State for 1915.

Entertainment, board and lodging, for eight men from each competing school begins, if necessary, at 8 p. m. Thursday and continues, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday. Kindly ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Traveling expenses are to be paid by the competing schools.

Eight complimentary tickets will be issued to each Faculty manager, admitting to all games. Managers should call for these upon arrival. These tickets are not transferable.

All managers must wire U. H. Smith of Bloomington, the time of arrival in Bloomington upon receipt of this notice.




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ELKHART HIGH SCHOOL BASKET BALL TEAM.

TRACK AND FIELD.

There were a number of good dual, triangular and other Track Meets last Spring and this work is proving more popular each year. It seems to be taking the place of Base Ball.

The State Track and Field Meet was held under the auspices of the three High Schools of Indianapolis and in the main was very successful. There were 64 schools represented and 325 boys were entered in the Meet. This event has been doubling each year in the number of schools and boys participating.

The main criticisms on last year's Meet were caused by the immense number of entries. The Board intends to conduct elimination trials prior to the afternoon of the Meet in the future. Better provisions are to be made for controlling the crowd and a Head Field Judge is to be selected to expedite the running of the Field events. This event is getting so large that Sectional Meets may have to be held in the future. Some such scheme as the following might be used. Sectional Meets could be held and the winners of first, second and third places in each event would qualify for the final Meet. This scheme might cut down the chances of any one school winning the final Meet but the number of schools represented and the quality of the competitors in the final Meet would be increased very much. The best material in the State would be entered in the Final Meet under this scheme. This is a matter for consideration of the High School Principals before our next annual meeting.

Information concerning the State Meet follows in detail:

High School Athletes of Today Are Better Performers Than Stars 10 and 15 Years Ago.

(Written prior to 1915 meet.)

"I would'nt mind going to Federal League park to see the high school meet Saturday," remarked one of the old timers the other night. "That is, if I thought the athletes of today were as good as they were when I attended High School. That was before the present Indiana High School Athletic Association was formed and governed track meets in 1904. I tell you those were the days of real athletes. The puny kid of today would stand a poor chance against such men. I would'nt mind seeing athletes perform if they were in the class of those stars."

"Athletes of the days you speak of did not make the records in track and field events that the track men have in this State since the present Association was formed," chimed in a leading authority on track records and athletes, who has since the days he attended Manual and Shortridge, and even after attending Notre Dame, never missed a State meet. Allison has among his treasures newspaper clippings, record books and programs of every High School meet held in this State, and many of the largest meets held during the last fifteen years in various parts of the country. It was to these that he referred to prove his argument. The result will prove a surprise to hundreds of alumni of the local High Schools who have imagined that the athletes under the old Association previous to 1904 were superior to the athletes of today.


The Indiana Interscholastic Athletic Association was formed at Richmond, but it was not until a meeting was held March 11, 1899, at the English hotel in this city, that its organization was perfected. At that meeting the following schools were represented: Indianapolis High School (later known as Shortridge,) Manual Training High School, Richmond, Muncie, Winchester and Lebanon. Purdue University sent an invitation for the annual track and field meet to be held at Lafayette, but it was decided that the games should be held in Indianapolis at Newby Oval. During the spring of 1899, 1900, 1901 and 1902 the State meet was held here each year. In 1903 no meet was held, but a dual meet between the two local schools at Fairgrounds. In that year invitational meets were held at Lafayette and Bloomington. It was in the following year that the new High School Athletic Association was formed under the name of the Indiana High School Athletic Association.

Records of the four meets under the old Association show that Manual always won first, and Shortridge always finished second. The other schools trailed out behind. In 1899, the teams finished: Manual, 60; Shortridge, 51; Hartford City, 10; Crawfordsville, 7; Muncie, 5; Covington, 2 and Richmond failed to score. In 1900 Manual got 63; Shortridge, 55; Covington, 11; Hartford City, Muncie, Crawfordsville and Lafayette failed to score. In 1901 the finish was; Manual, 82; Shortridge, 24; Veedersburg, 11; Crawfordsville, 10; Covington, 6 and Terre Haute, 1. In 1902 Manual got 67; Shortridge, 37 and the others won but few points. To be sure, there were many events in the old meets such as bicycle races, hop, step and jump and standing broad jump that are no longer in the annual meets. The fifty-yard dash is omitted. However, a careful comparison of the records of the athletes under the old Association with those of the present Association shows that the High School boy of the last twelve years is a better man physically than before that period.

To begin with the present record in the 100-yard dash is held by Blair of Hammond, who made it in 10 seconds flat at Crawfordsville in 1906. The old record was held by Bowers of Manual, who ran the distance in 10 1-5 seconds in 1901. He broke Alfred Ogle's record made by the Shortridge

High School man in 1900, which mark was 10¾ seconds. Blair is the only High School boy who ever covered the 100-yard distance in this State in the recognized time of 10 seconds, in other than a dual meet or in practice.

Heaton of Frankfort ran a 220-yard race with a mark of 23 1-5 seconds in 1903, which is the record for the distance under the old Association. The next year at Bloomington the first under the present Association, Joseph of Shortridge, defeated Blair of Hammond in a dive for the tape, while Heaton trailed so far behind he did not appear to be in the class of these two stars. The time was 23 3-5 seconds, which was 2-5 of a second slower than Heaton's record and made many doubt if Heaton had ever been able to cover the distance as fast as the time announced the year before. However, Blair removed all doubt as to who was the best High School sprinter when he set the mark of 23 seconds at Lafayette in 1905. Blair's record was tied by King of Manual at Lafayette in 1909. King ran the 220 in 23 seconds and made 100 yards in 10 2-5 seconds that day.

It was not until last year at Crawfordsville that a man appeared who could better the mark of the famous Thompson of Covington High School in the quarter-mile run. Thompson's record of 54 seconds for the 440-yard race, under the old association, stood supreme until Sims of Bloomfield last year ran the distance in 53¾ seconds. Sims not only broke Thompson's record and gave the new association a better mark for the distance than the old association could boast, but also bettered the record of Zimmer of Bloomington, 54 2-5 seconds, made at Bloomington in the first meet under the present association.

The present half-mile record held by Marchal of Gas City and made at Lafayette in 1909 is faster than the old association mark made on the same track in 1903 by Pingree of Monticello. Marchal's record is 2 minutes 7 seconds, while Pingree's mark is 2 minutes 8 seconds. When Jack Shidler circled Newby Oval four times and made the mark of 4 minutes 57 4-5 seconds in the mile, which is the old association record, it was said that the record would never be beaten and that the Manual star would always remain the High School record holder. Since the present association meets have been held that mark has been bettered eight times, and the present record is held by Newlin of Manual, made at Lafayette in 1909. His record is 4 minutes 45 1-5 seconds. Last year Umbles of Washington ran the distance in 4 minutes 47½ seconds.

In the old days there was an athlete whose work in both High School and College in the high hurdle, distance 120 yards, was of such a class that even the stars of the present association have never bettered his mark. That man was Tad Shidler of Manual, whose record for the 120-yard hurdle is 16 1-5. Shidler some years later while a member of the Indiana University track team and under the coaching of Jimmie Horn, former eastern champion for that distance, made at the World's Fair at St. Louis a mark of

fifteen seconds flat in the hurdles. That is the present world's record held by F. W. Kelly. Shidler's record was not allowed as there was but two watches on the race. These caught the time the same, however. Allison of Richmond tied Shidler's mark of 16:1-5 at Lafayette in 1909. However, Allison never afterward bettered his High School record. Allison's greatest race was his low hurdle, 220 yards, which he covered in 26:4-5, on the same day he made his other record. The low hurdle record under the old assocition was held by Stotler of Frankfort and was made in Lafayette in 1903. His mark was 28:3-5 which has been bettered a number of times under the present association. McAlevy of Crawfordsville won the 220-yard hurdle last year, his time being 28:¾.



Twelfth Annual I. H. S. A. A. Track and Field Meet

ANNOUNCEMENT.

The Twelfth Annual Track and Field Meet of the Indiana High School Athletic Association will be held at The Federal League Ball Park, Indianapolis, May 15, 1915, in the afternoon. Entries for the Meet will close Wednesday, May 5, and all schools desiring to participate in the Meet must become members of the association before that time.

Eligibility—Every contestant in this Meet must have previously made in a fair test a record equal to the following in every event in which he is entered:

100 Yard Dash	
220 Yard Dash	
440 Yard Dash	
Half Mile Run	
Mile Run	
120 Yard High Hurdles	19 s.
220 Yard Low Hurdles	
Running High Jump	5 ft.
Running Broad Jump	
Pole Vault

The above, together with a mile relay, will constitute the events of the Meet. Winning first place in any event counts five points; second place, three points; and third place, one point. Points in the relay will not be counted in determining the winning team. In case of a tie in any event the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

The order of events is as follows:

Track Events—100-yard dash trial; 120-yard hurdle trial; 100-yard dash final; one mile run; 440-yard run; 120-yard hurdle final; 220-yard dash trial; 220-yard hurdle trial; 880-yard run; 220-yard dash final; 220-yard hurdle final; relay.

Field Events—Discus; running high jump; shot put; pole vault; running broad jump.

Entries—The entries in each event are limited to three, and the contestants in each to two from any school; except in the relay race, in which entries will be limited to six, and the number placed in competition to four, each running one-fourth mile.

All schools, in order to enter the contests of the State Meet will be required to certify that all athletic contests in which they have taken part since becoming members of the Association have been conducted in accordance with the rules of the Indiana High School Athletic Association, and that all their contestants in such contests have been qualified according to rules.

Principals will be required to certify in writing that the contestants from their respective schools have all qualified in every event in which they are entered in the State Meet. Each Principal must fill out entry blanks with the names of the contestants from his school, and all required data, and send to A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, on or before May 5, 1915. THESE REQUIREMENTS MUST BE STRICTLY COMPLIED WITH. Special blanks for this purpose are enclosed.

Protests—All protests and complaints against members of the Association for violation of the rules must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before May 5. Protests as to the eligibility of individual contestants under the constitution are to be decided by the Board of Control, and may be filed with the Secretary at any time.

Management—The management of this Meet rests solely with the Board of Control. The selection of officials to be approved by the Board, has been delegated to the athletic management of the Indianapolis High Schools. The referee and starter are to be chosen from A. A. U., in order that records made at the Meet may be recognized by that body. The Board will arrange a program, assigning places on the track by lot, and the printed program will indicate the order in which the men will be called upon the track. The rules governing the Meet correspond to those of the Western Inter-Collegiate Amateur Athletic Association, except where these have been modified by the Board of Control. These rules, as adopted by the Board, are printed in the I. H. S. A. A. Hand Book of Athletics and Annual Report of the Board of Control. Copies may be had of the Permanent Secretary for 10c each, postpaid.

Prizes—No prizes will be awarded except a cup to the winning team, a pennant to the winning relay team, and badges for point winners. Admission will be fifty (50) cents. Contestants, one rubber, and the Faculty manager from each school will be admitted free.

Entertainment—The Indianapolis High Schools will furnish rooms and will also give to each Faculty manager one (1) dollar for each contestant, one rubber, and one manager for boarding expenses. Room entertainment will begin at 6:00 p. m., Friday, May 14, and will end at 8:00 p. m., Saturday


May 15. All teams must be accompanied by a Faculty Manager, who will be responsible for the conduct of the contestants.

Fees—A fee of fifty cents for each contestant must accompany the entries. This fee will be returned to the Principal of the school for all entries who actually participate in the Meet. Traveling is at the expense of the competing schools.

Warnings—Entries close Wednesday, May 5, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entry fee of fifty (50) cents for each contestant must accompany the entry blank. Special privileges will be granted to no one. Send all entry blanks and money to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Ind. Be sure to give all data called for for each contestant. Use the official blank for entering.







The Board of Control met in the Bowles Hotel, Bloomington, March 13, all members and the Permanent Secretary being present.


The details of the Sectional and Final Tourneys were discussed, com-

plete reports from most of the tourneys having been received. The statement of expenses for the final tourney was approved.

Amo High School was requested to pay Brazil High School a forfeiture of ten (10) dollars for failure to play a Basket Ball game at Brazil according to contract. The forfeiture was paid by Amo.

Scottsburg High School was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1916, for playing Jeffersonville High School, a non-member. It was also decided that Jeffersonville could not become a member until January 1, 1916 in case she desired to do so.

Thirteenth Annual Meeting

The 13th annual meeting of the I. H. S. A. A. was called to order by C. V. Haworth at 11:45 a. m. October 29, in the Masonic Auditorium, Indianapolis.

The reading of the minutes was not done because of limited time and the fact that all of the doings of the Association for the year are included

in the Hand Book, all members having copies.

Principals Ramsay, Foreman, Snarr and Smelser were nominated for the vacancy on the Board caused by the retiring member, C. V. Haworth. The vote stood as follows: Ramsay 46, Foreman 21, Snarr 13, Smelser 25. Principal Smelser moved that Principal Ramsay be given the unanimous ballot of the Association and the motion passed—Principal Ramsay being elected a member of the Board for three years beginning January 1, 1916.

Principal Stubbs, Turpin and Montgomery were appointed on a committee to report to the next Annual Meeting on a scheme for the certification

of officials.

The meeting decided to have sectional Basket Ball Tourneys and a final tourney; the details to be left to the Board of Control.

Representatives from the Chamber of Commerce, Butler College and the Indiana Dental College were present and invited the final Basket Ball Tourney to Indianapolis. Indiana University invited the final Tourney to Bloomington. The vote stood Indiana University-56, Indianapolis-41.

The time, place and all details of the Track Meet next spring were left in the hands of the Board of Control with the ruling that elimination con-

tests should be held prior to the afternoon of the Meet.

It was voted by the meeting that the 1914-1915 rules regarding dribbling should be used in all games played under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A. In all other particulars the 1915-1916 rules shall govern as given by Spalding.

A motion was made and passed that the Executive Committee of the State Teachers' Association be asked for a better time to hold the next annual meeting.

The question of lowering the standards of eligibility came up and by almost unanimous consent was accorded no consideration whatever.

The Indianapolis High Schools invited the Track and Field Meet to

Indianapolis again next spring.

The matter of permitting High Schools to enter the Association who had remained out for certain seasons in order to play ineligible ball was left entirely in the hands of the Board.

The meeting adjourned.

Board of Control Meeting

The Board of Control of the I. H. S A. A. met in the Severin Hotel, Indianapolis, at 8:30 a. m., October 30, all members and the Permanent Secretary being present.

Kenneth Lawrence and Herbert Maynard, students of the Columbus High School, were declared ineligible to participate in High School Athletics in the future, they having played on an independent team.

Will Hoff of the Wiley High School, Terre Haute, was declared a professional and thus barred from all High School Athletics in the future, for having played on an Independent team under an assumed name.

A protest by Cayuga against Perryville was considered but a decision was postponed until more evidence could be secured.

A protest by Goshen against Warsaw was postponed also until further evidence could be secured.

A controversy between Salem and Clearspring was carried over for settlement later on account of insufficient evidence.

The Reynolds and Wolcott High Schools were suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1916, for failure to carry on a Basket Ball game satisfactorily between these two schools.

The Permanent Secretary was authorized to get the Hand Book printed and also to send out return post-cards to ascertain what schools desired to enter the Basket Ball Tourneys this year.

The Board adjourned to meet at 6 p. m., November 6, in the Severin Hotel, Indianapolis.

Board of Control Meeting.

The Board of Control of the I. H. S. A. A. met in the Severin Hotel, Indianapolis, at 6 P. M. November 6, all members being present.

Merom College was denied membership in the I. H. S. A. A. because of the difficulty in determining eligibility in a school doing College work. Dates were set for the Sectional and Final Basket Ball Tourneys on March 10 and 11 and March 17 and 18 respectively.

The Goshen-Warsaw controversy regarding a game of foot ball at Warsaw was considered and decisions were rendered as follows:

Warsaw High School suspended until January 1, 1916, because of failure to conduct the game and control the crowd properly.

Mr. Lucas of Warsaw disqualified as an official in any games under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A. until June 1, 1916.

Salem and Clearspring High Schools were absolved from blame in playing a game when the latter school was not a member of the I. H. S. A. A. Warning was given concerning the future, however.

The Monon-Idaville controversy following a protest by the latter school decided by sustaining the Referee.

The Cayuga-Perryville controversy following a protest by the former school was decided by sustaining the Referee.

The Board voted to pay A. L. Trester, Per. Sec'y, \$100 above his regular salary for work connected with the Association.

Supt. Haworth was selected to write a statement concerning the Association to be published in the Hand Book.

Rules of the Indiana High School Athletic Association Regarding Track and Field Meets.

THURING THURING

Based on the Rules of the Intercollegiate Conference Athletic Association.

RULE I.

Officials.

Section 1. All meetings must be under the direction of

The Board of Control.

One referee.

Two or more inspectors.

Three or more field judges.

Three judges at finish.

Three or more timekeepers.

One starter.

One clerk of the course.

One scorer.

One marshal.

Sec. 2. If deemed necessary, assistants may be provided for the clerk of the course, the scorer and the marshal, and an official announcer may be appointed.

RULE II.


The Board of Control.

The Board of Control shall have jurisdiction of all matters not assigned by these rules to the referee or other game officials.

RULE III.

The Referee.


The referee must decide all questions relating to the actual conduct of the Meet, whose final settlement is not otherwise covered by these rules, and shall have the power to add to or alter the announced arrangements of heats in any event. A referee has no authority, after heats have been drawn and published in a program, to transfer a contestant from one heat to another.

When in any but the final heat of a race a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to culpable carelessness, and shall also have power to allow the hindered competitor to start in the next round of heats, just as if he had been placed in his trial.

When in a final heat a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to his carlessness or conduct, and he shall also have the power to order a new race between such of the competitors as he thinks entitled to such a privilege.

If during the athletic contest under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A. a competitor shall conduct himself in a manner unbecoming a gentleman or offensive to the officials, spectators or competitors, the referee shall have the power to disqualify him from further competition at the Meet; and if he thinks the offense worthy of additional punishment, must promptly make a detailed statement of the facts to the Board of Control.

Power to change the order of events as laid down in the official program is reserved to the Board of Control, which shall, through its chairman, exercise this authority, unless it sees fit to expressly delegate this power to the referee.

The referee shall not have authority to disqualify any competitor for violation of the eligibility rule of the I. H. S. A. A. All protests as to eligibility made on the field must be referred to the Board of Control, and the protested competitor must be allowed to compete until disqualified by the arbitrator of the I. H. S. A. A.

RULE IV.

The Inspectors.

It shall be the duty of the inspector to stand at such point as the referee may designate, to watch the competition closely, and, in case of claim of foul, to report to the referee what he saw of the incident. Such inspectors are merely assistants to the referee, to whom they must report, and have no power to make any decision.

RULE V.

The Judges of the Finish.

The judges of the finish must determine the order of finishing of contestants, and must arrange among themselves as to noting the winner, second, third and fourth, etc., as the case may require, and there must always be two judges, whose duty must be to choose the winner.

Their decision in this respect must be without appeal, and in case of a disagreement a majority must govern.

RULE VI.

The Field Judges.

The field judges must make an accurate measurement and keep a tally of all trials of competitors in the high and broad jumps, the pole vaults, the weight competitions and the discust hrows.

They must act as judges in these events, and their decisions must like wise be without appeal. In case of disagreement, a majority must govern. There must be at least three judges for every event.

RULE VII.

The Timekeepers.

The timekeepers must be three in number, and must individually time all events where time record is called for. At the conclusion of each heat, each timekeeper must present his watch to the referee for inspection, and he must decide the official time. Should two of the three watches mark the same time and the third disagree, the time marked by said two watches must be accepted. Should all three disagree, the time marked by the intermediate watch must be accepted.

The flash of the pistol must denote the actual time of starting.

If, for any reason, only two watches are held on any event, and they fail to agree, the longer time of the two must be accepted.

RULE VIII.

The Starter.

The starter must have sole jurisdiction over the competitors after the clerk of the course has properly placed them in their position for the start.

The method of starting must be by pistol report, except that in time handicap races the word "go" must be used.

An actual start is not effected until the pistol has been purposely discharged after the competitors have been warned to get ready.

In case the pistol was not purposely discharged, the competitors shall be called back by the starter by pistol fire.

Note—The starter must have at least two good cartridges in his pistol before starting a heat.

When any part of the person of a competitor touches the ground in front of his mark before the signal is given, it must be considered a false start.

Penalties for false starting must be inflicted by the starter, as follows: In all races to and including 125 yards, the competitor must be put back one yard for the first and another yard for the second attempt; in races over 125 yards and including 300 yards, two yards for the first and two more for the second attempt; in races over 300 yards and including 600 yards, three yards for the first and three more for the second attempt; in races over 600 yards and including 1,000 yards, four yards for the first and four more for the second attempt; in races over 600 yards and including 1,000 yards, four yards for the first and four more for the second attempt;

ond attempt; in races over 1,000 yards and including one mile, five yards for the first and five more for the second attempt; in all races over one mile, ten yards for the first attempt and ten more for the second attempt.

In all cases, the third false start must prevent his competing in that event.

The starter must rule out of that event any competitor who attempts to advance himself from his mark, as perscribed in the official program, after he has been given the warning to "get ready."

RULE IX.

Clerk of the Course.

The clerk of the course must be provided with the names and the numbers of all entered competitors, and he must notify them to appear at the starting line before the start in each event in which they are entered.

RULE X.

The Scorer.

The scorer must record the order in which each competitor finishes his event, together with the time furnished by the referee.

He must keep a tally of the laps made by each competitor in races covering more than one lap, and must announce, by means of a bell or otherwise, when the leading man enters the last lap.

He must draw up a list of the actual competitors in each event, which shall be filed with the papers of the Association, and shall be the official record of competing entrants, and shall be final evidence in the enforcement of Rule III, of the rules of eligibility.

He must control his assistants and assign to them such of his duties as he may deem proper.

RULE XI.

The Marshal.

The marshal must have police charge of the enclosure, and must prevent any but officers and actual competitors from entering or remaining therein. He must control his assistants and assign to them their duties.

RULE XII.

The Official Announcer.

The official announcer must receive from the scorer and field judges the result of each event, and announce the same by voice or by means of a bulletin board.

RULE XIII. Competitors.

Competitors must report to the Clerk of the Course immediately upon their arrival at the place of meeting, and must be provided by that official with their proper numbers, which must be worn conspicuously by the competitors when competing, and without which they must not be allowed to start. Each competitor must inform himself of the time of starting, and must be promptly at the starting point of each competition in which he is entered, and there report to the Clerk of the Course.

Under no condition shall attendants be allowed to accompany competitors at the start or during any competition.

RULE XIV.

Track Measurement.

All distances run or walked must be measured upon a line eighteen inches outward from the inner edge of the track, except that in races on straight-away tracks the distance must be measured in a direct line from the starting mark to the finishing line.

RULE XV.

The Course.

Each competitor must keep in his respective position from start to finish in all races on straightaway tracks, and in all races on tracks with one or more turns, he must not cross to the inner edge of the track, except when he is at least six feet in advance of his nearest competitor. After turning the last corner into the straight in any race, each competitor must run a straight course to the finish line, and must not cross to either the outside or inside from such straight course in front of his opponents.

In all races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

The referee must disqualify from that event any competitor who willfully pushes against, impedes, crosses the course of, or in any way interferes with another competitor.

The referee must disqualify from further participation in the Meet any contestant competing to lose, to coach, or in any way impede the chances of another competitor, either in a trial or a final contest.

RULE XVI.

The Finish.

The finish of the course must be represented by a line between two finishing posts, drawn across and at right angles to the sides of the track, and four feet above which line must be stretched a tape, attached at either end to the finishing posts. A finish must be counted when any part of the winners body, except his hands or arms, touches the tape at the finishing line. The tape must be considered the finishing line for the winners, but their order of finishing across the track line must determine the position of the other competitors.

RULE XVII.

Hurdles.

In the 120 yards hurdle race, ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be three feet six inches high. They must be placed ten yards apart, with the first hurdle fifteen yards distant from the starting point, and the last hurdle fifteen yards before the finishing line.

In the 220 yards hurdle race, ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be two feet six inches high. They must be placed twenty yards apart, with the first hurdle twenty yards distant from the starting mark, and the last hurdle twenty yards before the finishing line.

In making a record it must be necessary for the competitor to jump every hurdle in its proper position.

In all hurdle races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have separate hurdles and a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

A competitor knocking down three or more hurdles, or any portion of three or more hurdles, in any race shall be disqualified.

RULE XVIII.

Jumping.

Section 1. A fair jump must be one that is made without the assistance of weights, diving, somersaults, or handsprings of any kind.

In scratch events competitors must jump in order as placed on program.

Sec. 2. The running high jump.—The field judges must decide the height at which the jumpshall commence, and must regulate the succeeding elevations.

Each competitor must be allowed three trial jumps at each height, and if on the third trial he shall fail, he must be declared out of the competition.

Competitors must jump in order, as provided in Section 1; then those failing, if any, must have their second trial jump in a like order, after which those who have failed twice must make their third trial jump.

The jump must be made over a bar resting on pins projecting not more than three inches from the uprights, and when this bar is removed from its place by the competitor when trying, it must be counted as a trial jump.

Running under the bar in making an attempt to jump must be counted as a "balk," and three successive "balks," must be counted as a trial jump.

The distance of the run before the jump must be unlimited. A competitor may decline to jump at any height in his turn, and by so doing forfeits his rights to again jump at the height declined.

Sec. 4. The running broad jump.—When jumped on earth, a joist five inches wide must be sunk flush with it. The outer edges of this joist must be called the scratch line, and the measurement of all jumps must be made

from it, at right angles, to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the person of the competitor.

In front of the scratch line the ground must be removed to the depth of three and the width of twelve inches outward.

A foul jump must be one where the competitor, in jumping off the scratch line, makes a mark on the ground immediately in front of it, or runs over the line without jumping, and must count as a trial jump without results.

Each Competitor must have three trial jumps, and the best three must have three more trial jumps.

The competition must be decided by the best of all the jumps of the competitors.

The distance of the run before the scratch line must be unlimited.

Sec. 5. The pole vault.— A pole must be furnished by the managing committee, but contestants may use their own private poles if they so desire, and no contestant shall be allowed to use any of these private poles except by the consent of their owners. The poles must be unlimited as to size and weight, but must have no assisting devices, except that they may be wrapped or covered with any substance (to obtain a firmer grip,) and may have one prong at the end.

No competitor shall, during the vault, raise the hand which was uppermost when he left the ground to a higher point of the pole, nor shall he raise the hand which was undermost when he left the ground to any point on the pole above the other hand.

The rules governing the running high jump must also govern the pole vault for height, except when the man leaves the ground in an attempt it shall be counted a trial.

RULE XIX.

Putting the Shot.

The shot must be a solid sphere, made of metal, and must weight twelve pounds.

It must be put with one hand, and in making the attempt it must be above, and not behind, the shoulder.

The competitor must stand in a circle seven feet in diameter. The circumference of the cirle must be divided into halves by a line drawn through the center of the circle. On four feet of the front half of the circumference a board four inches high must be placed, the edge of which must be equally distant from the intersection of the line with the circumference, and at which the competitor must stand when the shot leaves his hand.

A fair put shall be one where no part of the person of the competitor touches in front of the circle, or on the board, in making the attempt.

A put must be counted as a foul if the competitor steps outside the circle or on the board. A competitor must leave the circle by the rear half. Leaving by the front half must be declared a foul.

The measurement of all puts must be made from the nearest mark by the shot to a point on the circumference of the circle on a line with the object mark and the center of the circle.

Foul puts and letting go to the shot in making an attempt must be counted as trial puts without results.

A board similar to the one in front may be used at the back of the circle.

The order of competing and the number of trials shall be the same as for the running broad jump. Shots must be furnished by the managing committee. Any contestant may use his own private shot, if correct in weight and shape; in which case the other contestants must be allowed to use it if they wish.

RULE XX.

Throwing the Discus.

The discus shall be made of smooth hardwood body, without finger holes, weighted in the center with lead discs and capped with polished brass discs, with steel ring on the outside. The weight of the discus shall be four and one-half pounds; outside diameter, eight inches; thickness in center, two inches.

All throws must be made from a seven-foot circle, with four-foot lap-boards, and similar in all respects to the circle for putting the shot. In making his throws, a competitor may assume any position he chooses. Foul throws and letting go of the discus in attempts shall count as trials without result. A fair throw shall be one in which no part of the person of the competitor touches the ground outside the front half of the circle, and the competitor leaving the circle by its rear half. A throw shall be foul if any part of the person touches the ground outside of the front half of the circle before the throw is measured.

The order of competing and number of trials shall be the same as for the running broad jump.

A discus shall be furnished by the managing committee.

RULE XXI.


Ties.

In case of a tie in any event, the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

RULE XXII.

Relay Racing.

- 1. A line must be drawn twenty feet in front of each starting line. Between these two lines each runner must touch the succeeding runner. Failure to do this disqualifies the team in that event. The judges must see that all touches are properly made.
- The same rule with reference to fouls, coaching or impeding a runner in any way, apply to relay racing as to other events.
- 3. No member of a relay team can run back of the line, nor can one man run two relays in any team.
 - 4. The positions of the team must be drawn for.






GARFIELD (TERRE HAUTE) BASKET BALL TEAM.

Constitution of the Indiana High School Athletic Association

(Revised January 1, 1915.)

THE REAL PROPERTY OF THE PERSONNELLE

Administration

Officers:

Section 1. A Board of Control, composed of three members (principals, members of the faculty or superintendents) shall be elected by the Association, December 29, 1903, as follows: One for one year, one for two years, one for three years, the chairman each year to be the one whose term expires at the end of that year. Thereafter each member of the Board shall be elected for three years. This election is to take place at the annual meeting of the Indiana State Teachers' Association. In case of vacancy, the remaining members of the Board may appoint a person to fill the vacancy until the next annual meeting of the Association.

- Sec. 2 On and after the adoption of this amendment every newly elected member of the Board of Control shall assume the duties of his office on the first day of January, next following.
- Sec. 3. No retiring member of the Board of Control, having served three years shall be eligible for re-election for a period of one year after date of retirement.
- Sec. 4. The Board of Control shall have the following powers and duties: (a) It shall have general control over all athletic contests between secondary schools in this Association; (b) It shall have exclusive control of the annual Inter-scholastic Meet; (c) It shall give interpretations of the rules of the Association; (d) It shall determine forfeitures under Sec. 11; (e) The Board of Control, at the end of any athletic season may, at its discretion, issue a statement of its official opinion as to the relative standing of teams. No school which has violated the rules of the Association in regard to the qualifications of players shall be awarded special honors in that particular branch of athletics.

Sec. 5. (a) When charges are made in writing by a member of the Association against another member for violation of the rules of the Association, the Board of Control, after giving due notice of the place and time for the school so charged to be heard, shall consider such charges, and may suspend the offending school for a period not exceeding one year. (b) The Board of Control shall decide upon all protests brought before it with reference to qualifications of contestants in the Inter-scholastic Meet. (c) When any matter comes before the Board for decision which is of special interest to a school of which a member of the Board is a representative, the remaining members shall appoint another person to act in his place in that matter.

Sec. 6. At the annual meeting of 1906 a **Permanent Secretary** shall be elected, who shall have charge of the property and records of the Association; shall receive all money for dues and the sale of publications of the Association; shall issue all circulars authorized by the Board of Control; shall attend meetings of the Board when requested to do so by the Board; shall turn over to the Treasurer of the Board all money in his possession when called upon to do so; shall perform such other duties as the growth of the Association as determined by the Board may require; and shall receive as compensation the sum of \$50 annually, and such allowance for expenses as the Board may approve. Vacancies in the office may be declared by the Board for cause, and a successor appointed by the Board to act until the next annual meeting.

It shall be the duty of the Permanent Secretary to publish the I. H. S. A. A. year book immediately following the annual meeting of the Association.

Local Management:

Sec. 7. The **Principal** or his authorized representative shall accompany his team to all contests.

Sec. 8. The principal of the school, or high school teachers authorized by him, shall be manager or managers of the teams representing the school.

Sec. 9. No games shall be played without the sanction of the principal.

Sec. 10. The eligibility of all the contestants shall be certified to by the principal of the school in accordance with the rules hereby adopted. Such statements shall be presented in writing within ten days before any contest. In case of disputes the principal must furnish the Board of Control the following data in regard to each contestant: The date of last enrollment; the number of years he has been a member of a secondary school athletic team; date and place of birth; average mark in each study for the last preceding term in school; average mark in each study from the beginning of the current term or semester. A school which does not furnish this data shall be denied championship honors, and may be excluded from the Annual Interscholastic meet.

- Sec. 11. The principal has power and is advised to exclude any contestant who, because of bad habits or improper conduct, would not represent his school in a becoming manner.
- Sec. 12. It is recommended that principals, in arranging for games, provide a forfeit of \$10, to be exacted should there be a failure on the part of either party to carry out the arrangements made. Should such forfeitures be stipulated and not be paid during the same season, the Board of Control, after hearing both sides, shall have authority to expel the delinquent school from the Association. Notification of such expulsion shall be published in the papers, with cause therefor.
- Sec. 13. **Paid Coaches,** other than those regularly employed as teachers by the trustees of the school, are prohibited. By paid coach is meant any person who receives, directly or indirectly, remuneration of any kind, money, traveling expenses, gifts, etc., in return for services rendered in instructing or coaching any high school athletic team.
- Sec. 14. Each school in the Association shall report to the Permanent Secretary a list of pupils representing the school in athletic contests during the year. Each school is asked to report also the kind of treatment accorded them to, from and on the field, while guests of another school.

Officials:

- Sec. 15. On and after January 1, 1910, all the **Major Officials** in all athletic contests participated in by teams connected with schools in the I. H. S. A. A. shall be regularly licensed teachers in the public schools of Indiana or shall be persons whose names have been furnished and approved by the Board of Control. It is recommended that these officials shall be disinterested, and it is required that when a school demands disinterested officials at the time of scheduling the game, such officials shall be furnished. The Board shall drop from its list of approved officials any person who is palpably unfair and biased in his decision in games.
- Sec. 16. Non-playing student officials or assistants shall conform to the same rules as the players.

Membership:

Sec. 17. Membership in this Association shall be limited to public High Schools of the state, and each school shall have one vote. The annual dues shall be \$1.50, payable when the school becomes a member, and thereafter by January 1 of each year, in advance.

Acadamies with commissioned high school standing shall be eligible to membership in the Association, and wherever the word "high school" appears in this Constitution it shall be understood to apply equally to these academies.

Beginning with the year 1914, and every year thereafter, the fiscal year of the Indiana High School Athletic Association shall close on December 31.

Games and Game Rules:

Sec. 18. No games shall be played with high schools of this state not belonging to the Association.

This rule does not prevent a member of the Association from playing high school teams outside of the state, nor from playing non-high school teams within the state, except as follows:

It is a violation of the Constitution for schools in the Association to play non-high school teams including high school boys, unless the latter are certified as eligible by the Principal of the school to which they belong.

Sec. 19. The games recognized by the I. H. S. A. A. shall be: Foot Ball, Rugby Foot Ball, Soccer, Basket Ball, Track Work and Base Ball. Further, all forms of inter-school athletic games shall be subject to the rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Sec. 20. The number of interscholastic foot ball games played by any team in one season is limited to six.

Sec. 21. In all foot ball contests held under these rules, the length of each half shall be twenty-five minutes, unless changed by mutual consent.

Sec. 22. The basket ball rules as published in Spalding's Official Basket Ball rule book, shall be the official rules governing all contests between members of the I. H. S. A. A. However, the rule governing the selection of officials in the above rules shall be void, and unless otherwise agreed by mitual consent, each school shall furnish one official, and these officials shall alternate their duties, each acting as referee and each acting as umpire one half.

Rules.

Eligibility


Rule 1. To represent a school in any interscholastic contest, a person must be under twenty-one years of age; must have entered some public high school within the first twenty school days of the semester in which the contest occurs, and must be an amateur as defined by the A. A. U. Eighth grade pupils are not eligible. A semester is one-half of a school year.

(The term "Amateur" is defined and explained in Spalding's Official Handbook of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America for 1914.)

Rule 2. Any pupil who has been enrolled twenty (20) or more days from September 1 to December 1 of same year for each of four semesters will be ineligible to play football a fifth semester.

"Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from December 1 to March 1 of the next year for each of four semesters shall be eligible to play a fifth semester, provided he meets the requirements of the other eligibility rules; provided further that no pupil shall represent his school longer than four years."

INTERPRETATION – This rule applies only to students entering school during the second semester of the school year, and enrollment in school rather than participation in athletics shall determine the eligibility of all students.

Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from March 1 to June 1 of the same year for each of four semesters shall be ineligible to play base ball a fifth semester.

INTERPRETATION - This section covers all branches of athletics.

- Rule 3. A pupil withdrawing permanently from school within the first twenty school days of the semester shall not be regarded as having an opportunity to engage in athletics that semester unless he has already played in one or more interscholastic games, in which case he shall be regarded as having engaged in Athletics for that season.
- Rule 4. **Post Graduates** are not eligible, but pupils graduating from regular three year courses shall not be deemed post graduates.
- Rule 5. A student is a post graduate of a school after he has completed the work required for graduation by that school, irrespective of the time of granting the diploma.
- Rule 6. Pupils meeting requirements for graduation in three and onehalf years in high schools with regular four year course shall be eligible to participate in school athletics the last half of the fourth year, provided they meet all other eligibility rules of the I. H. S. A. A.
- Rule 7. Time spent in athletic sport by pupils while in grades below the high school shall not be counted as part of the four years.
 - Rule 8. No person shall enter a contest under an assumed name.
- Rule 9. Any member of a high school athletic team who participates in an athletic contest as a member of any other similar team the same season, shall be ineligible to compete under these rules for the remainder of that season.

An exception is hereby made for basket ball and basket ball players in those towns and cities whose schools have no gymnasium and whose students are forced by necessity to use a Y. M. C. A. or some other gymnasium for their practice games. It is a well known fact that the use of such gymnasium by high school students under such circumstances will likely require that such students play on the teams of the organizations maintaining such gym-

nasiums. No student, however, will be permitted to play on any other team than that representing the organization controlling the gymnasium, and no student will be allowed to play in the teams of the latter without the knowledge and consent of his principal.

Rule 10. Each contestant must have and be maintaining for the current semester, a passing grade in each of three or more studies requiring a minimum of fifteen regular high school recitations per week, exclusive of rhetoricals, physical culture, military drill and deportment; in his last preceding semester in school he must also have met the same requirements throughout the entire term.

Pupils enrolled for the first time must comply with the requirements of the rules, the average standing required for the preceding semester being obtained from the records in the last secondary school attended.

Back work may be made up, providing that it is done in accordance with the regular rules of the school and becomes a matter of final record before the next semester.

INTERPRETATION — In each of the studies representing the minimum requirement of work specified above: (a) For the current semester the average of the monthly grades up to the time of certification must be passing; (b) for the current or school month the average of the daily or weekly grades must be passing; (c) if the average of the monthly grades at the beginning of any month is below passing in any study, the pupil is ineligible so far as that study is concerned for the entire month.

Rule 11. No person who has been enrolled as a student in an institution of college standing, and has done work which may be counted toward a degree in that institution, shall be eligible as a member of any athletic team under I. H. S. A. A, rules in any game with any other team, either within or without the State of Indiana.

Rule 12. The eligibility rules of this Association shall apply to students taking part in all contests, whether with schools inside or outside the State of Indiana.

Rule 13. On and after January 1, 1911, no student shall be eligible to play foot ball unless he has been examined by a regular physician and his physical condition has been pronounced satisfactory. Further, such student shall not be eligible until the physician's certificate has been filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. Said certificate shall be good from September 1 to December 1, only.

Rule 14. On and after January 1, 1911, no pupil shall be eligible to play foot ball without the written consent of his father, mother or guardian. Said written consent shall be attested by the Principal or Faculty Manager,

and shall be filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. The copy of said written consent shall be attached to the physician's certificate when filed with the Permanent Secretary.

Interpretations.

First. A game is any athletic contest where an admission fee is charged, or where any collection or contribution is received from spectators.

Second. The foot ball season is defined as beginning with the opening of school and closing with November 30.

Third. No student who violates the rules of the Association will be reinstated by the Board.

Fourth. A pupil who has played in one or more interscholastic games in any season shall be regarded as having engaged in athletics for that season.

Fifth. When a member or members of any team are protested, the game should be played as scheduled and the protest filed with the Board for settlement later.

Sixth. By mutual consent of both teams, pupils over the age limit may be allowed to enter the contests under I. H. S. A. A. rules.

Seventh. Pupils under twenty-one at the time of registration in school shall be so regarded until the time of their next registration.

Eighth. Any student, who carries at least 15 hours of regular High School work, is a High School student.

Ninth. It is recommended that Principals take proper measures to control the crowd and the players in all contests. Failure to do so shall be considered sufficient grounds for expulsion from the Association.

Notes.

- 1. Parents and Physician's certificates, contracts for all contests, eligibility certificates, blanks for certification of officials, and blanks for reporting contests will be furnished in quantities upon application to the Permanent Secretary. Please state definitely the kind and number of each wanted.
 - 2. The Annual Handbook will be sent upon receipt of ten cents.
- Copies of the Constitution will be furnished at fifty cents per hundred.
- 4. All correspondence and remittances from members of the Association to the Board of Control or to the Permanent Secretary must be indorsed by the principal or a member of the faculty.
- 5. Spalding's 1914-15 Basket Ball Guide will be used regarding dribbling but the 1915-16 Guide will be used in all other particulars.
- 6. The Board of Control for 1916 is as follows: W. A. Denny, Anderson; E. E. Ramsey, Bloomington; J. H. Shock, Lafayette; A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Permanent Secretary.














