# To the Indiana High School Athletic Association

The Indiana High School Athletic Association from the time of its organization in 1903 has stood for higher and better things along the lines of inter-school athletics among the High Schools of the State. It is an organization of which its members may well be proud. It ranks high among the best of such organizations the country over and it stands above them all in the matter of effective and efficient administration.

There is scarcely a school of the larger ones that does not belong to the Association and many of the very small schools find it to their advantage to be members. Membership in the Association affords the school unlimited opportunity for teaching law-abiding citizenship, not only to the members of an athletic team, but also to all the students that follow the games. There is no organization extant within the State that so directly and effectively helps to solve many knotty problems in discipline.

Football is still being played by schools in the northern and southern parts of the State, but through the central portion of the State, a game of football between High Schools is quite unusual. Parental objection and the belief among school men that football is not a suitable game for High School boys, is responsible for the lack of interest in the game.

Interest in track and field athletics is spreading rapidly. In recent years the entries in the different events have been so numerous that it has become impracticable to hold a State meet open to all members of the Association. In consequence of this situation the State Meeting October 26, 1916, decided to hold district track and field meets and authorized the Board of Control to conduct them.

Baseball is being played by some schools of the State but interest in the game is not very general, due to the short playing season of so many schools and the positive hindrance of the game by bad weather. It is to be regretted that the national pastime cannot be given a more prominent place in the athletics program of the High Schools.

In the absence of a suitable fall game to be substituted for football, many schools begin playing basketball at the opening of school in the fall and continue playing the game till the final games at the district and State
'tournaments in March. The interest in basket ball during the last season was unusual. Over four hundred schools played the game in the Association and half as many played out of the Association. The season culminated in district tournaments that were highly successful both as athletic carnivals of sport and pastime, and financially. The State tournament, in the opinion of the writer, was the best exhibition of uniformly good basketball playing of any tournament since it has been made an annual affair.

The annual meeting has in recent years been made the time and place for surprises along the line of amendments to the Constitution. Members of the Association should have full knowledge of all amendments that are to receive consideration in the meeting, prior to the day of the meeting. To this end the constitution should be amended so that no proposition to amend could be considered (without unanimous consent) unless it was printed and sent out to all members at least thirty days prior to the meeting.

## The Indiana High School Athletic Association

## 

The Indiana High School Athletic Association was organized in 1903 by a small group of High School Principals for the purpose of managing High School Athletics to the end that such would be made clean and sportsmanlike in all particulars. The idea advanced then and which has been held to since is that High School Athletics should be governed by the pleasure and love of the sports entered into. Direct physical, mental and moral benefits were considered of more value than the winning of the games or the mercenary gains. The Board of Control composed of three members elected by a general vote of the membership, to represent no particular districts but the good of High School Athletics in the whole State, did all of the work for three years after the initial organization. A Permanent Secretary was then chosen to carry on such work as the Board or the State Association should decide upon. This was a very necessary step because of the work of the Association and because the personnel of the Board changed in one member each year and entirely in three years. By choosing a Permanent Secretary the interpretations, rulings, reports, decisions, etc., of the Board and of the Association could be kept for all time and all purposes. Much credit is due to the charter members of the I. H. S. A. A. and the first Board of Control should be given especial credit for their work in getting the organization in good order.

The Association has been very fortunate in securing the services of fairminded and efficient officers at all times and the success of the I. H. S. A. A. is due largely to the fact that the "square deal" has been the guiding motto at all times. A mere mention of the names of the officers of the I. H. S. A. A. since its organization proves conclusively the statements just made. A complete list follows: L. D. Coffman, Geo. W. Benton, J. T. Giles, C. W. Knouff, E. E. Ramsey, L. N. Hines, I. E. Neff, A. L. Trester, E. W. Montgomery, C. V. Haworth, J. H. Shock, W. A. Denny.

The membership which has been open at all times to all Public High Schools of the State has grown steadily since the organization of the Association. This has been true not because of any "boosting" or any special favors shown but because the schools have seen year after year the benefits accruing from membership in the Association. Several High Schools have been suspended from the Association during its life but not a single school
has remained outside after the period of suspension was up. The smallest as well as the largest have been received on equal terms and the honors have gone accordingly. Absolutely no discrimination has been made in the latter particular.

While the growth in membership is very encouraging a more encouraging matter is the exaltation of the "gentleman athlete" and fair play at all times. Such an increase in membership plainly proves a growth in quality because school men have recognized the benefits of such membership along the quality line. The mere fact of so many schools joining year after year speaks for quality first. Principals, teachers, superintendents, pupils and the laymen all agree that the I. H. S. A. A. is the most valuable organization among the High schools of the State today. Not only has Indiana learned to value our State Athletic Association but several other States have patterned their organizations similarly to the Indiana organization. The requests for Hand Books and literature concerning the I. H. S. A. A. from other states have been many and wide-spread.

Principals all over the State unite in saying that the State Association is one of the best means of good discipline in their schools and communities. They have mentioned the following benefits of membership in the Association:

1. Improvement in scholarship.
2. The "gentleman athlete" is honored.
3. Local pressure relieved by having final decisions rendered elsewhere by a disinterested Board.
4. Standards of eligibility uniform in all schools.
5. Student management removed.
6. Better feeling between schools.
7. Contracts must be carried out.
8. The "ringer" banished.
9. Interpretations made uniform.
10. Better officials secured.
11. An efficient way of dealing with other organizations.

There are some things sadly needed, however, to make the I. H. S. A. A. stand for all that it should. Much room for improvement is seen in many places and many problems are yet unsolved. Foremost among these are the following:

1. Elimination of the so-called physical director who is nothing more than a paid coach.
2. Higher standards among Principals and coaches. The I. H. S. A.A. at present is just as strong as the individual Principals and just as weak also.
3. Better official work. State and sectional conferences for officials, coaches and managers would help much here.
4. Elimination of the importation of players.
5. Elimination of the idea that the team is the whole of High School Athletics and that to win is the one and only thing to be sought for.
6. "Sport for sport's sake" should be the motto of all High Schools. The benefits of winning, of physical training, of moral training, etc., will follow the spirit of such a motto.
7. Recognition by the State Public School System that there is a voluntary organization in the State of 450 High Schools, which is doing a noble and much needed work in caring for the physical side of the education of the boys and girls in these High Schools.

## BASKETBALL.

This season was the most successful yet experienced in the history of the game in Indiana High Schools. The games throughout the season including the Sectional Tourney games and the Final Tourney games brought out the best playing and a greater number of players than had ever been seen in the I. H.S. A. A. The game is fast becoming the most popular sport in High School athletics and the local gymnasium in many places is coming to be the meeting place of the old and the young. Few old High Schools are without gymnasiums and practically all new ones have them.

The number of districts increased from fourteen to sixteen and the number of teams participating increased from 155 to 204. Most of the mistakes of last year were prevented this year and the Tourneys were very successful.

Indiana University again handled the Final Tourney and gave satisfaction in every way save the seating capacity at the games. This objection will be eliminated upon completion of the new gymnasium there, however. The management of the Tourney and the uniform courtesy shown the visitors was very commendable, indeed.

Better officiating was seen in nearly all of the tourneys, and there were no objections to any of the schedules arranged by the Board of Control. The Board could not accept all of the invitations to hold Sectional Tourneys even if the Center Principals were required to entertain the teams and pay their traveling expenses in addition. Following is information in detail concerning the Tourneys:

## Announcement of I. H. S. A. A. Sectional and Final Basketball Tourneys, 1916.

## THE FIFTH ANNUAL

In accordance with the vote of the State Association at the last annual meeting October 29, 1915, the Board of Control has completed the details for the State Championship Basket Ball Tourney and announces the scheme in full.

## SECTIONAL TOURNEYS MARCH 10 and 11

The following bases were used in selecting centers: (1) Locationgeographical and with reference to schools desiring to participate. (2) Railway and Interurban facilities. (3) General conditions-attitude of local authorities, floors, entertaining facilities, etc.

Schools have been assigned by Counties with the intention of having about the same number in each Tourney. The following scheme gives the Centers and also the Counties assigned to each center. The name of your County locates your Center. The Board reserves the right to re-adjust the scheme if unforseen conditions make it advisable and necessary. The numbets indicate the schools from each county that have expressed their desire to enter.

Management-The management of these Tourneys rests solely with the Board of Control. Local arrangements have been delegated to the Center Principals. Two officials for each Tourney will be selected by the Board and none but fair, disinterested and competent men will be chosen. All schedules of Hours, Floors, Teams and Officials will be made out and printed by the Board. These schedules will be made by lot and no changes will be made in them.

Open Contest-These Tourneys are open to all members of the Association, irrespective of their season's record.

Protests-All protests against teams or individuals must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before March 1, at 11:00 a. m. Protests must be accompanied by evidence.

Entertainment-Teams are limited to seven men, and no more can be certified to. The Center Principals have contracted with the Board to entertain eight men (which must include the faculty manager) from each competing school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at $7 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Friday, March 10 , and continue if necessary to $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Sunday, March 12. Printed schedules will be sent to each competing school in plenty of time to arrange for making the trip, etc. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Expenses-An entrance fee of one (1) dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank, which money will go into the treasury of the I. H. S. A. A. to defray expenses of the Tourneys incurred by the Board of Control. The Center Principals have contracted to pay transportation expenses of the competing schools according to the following conditions:

After all expenses, save those of transportation, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained. The first one hundred (100) dollars or part thereof in this balance shall belong to the Center Principal. If there is
more than one hundred (100) dollars in the balance the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid or such part thereof as the balance prorated will give each school, the Tourney Center not sharing. Any balance yet remaining shall belong to the Center Principal.

Privileges-All competing teams, one rubber and one faculty manager from each team, are to be admitted free to all games.

Eligibility-The eligibility of each player must be certified to by the Principal of the school sending the team. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. Entries will close Wednesday, March 1. This means that they must be in the hands of the Permanent Secretary complete in every detail on that date.

Admission Fee-The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one (1) dollar for season tickets and no more shall be received for said tickets. No more tickets shall be sold than the capacity of the house will justify.

Prizes - No prizes of any kind are to be awarded to any school or individual.

Distribution of Tickets-An equitable distribution of tickets shall be made among the competing schools based on distance, enrollment in High School, and probable attendance from the competing schools. Any unfair methods or prices higher than those mentioned in this announcement should be reported to the Board of Control with evidence.

Warnings-Entries close Wednesday, March 1, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entrance fee of $\$ 1.00$ must accompany each entry blank. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks and money to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana. All data must be given on entry blank.

## FINAL TORNEY, BLOOMINGTON, MARCH 17 AND 18

Entrants-The winning teams of the Sectional Tourneys shall constitute the participants in the Final Tourney.

Entries-Teams are limited to seven men and no more can be certified to. These teams may or may not be made up of the same men that participated in the Sectional Tourneys. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. These are due in the hands of the Permanent Secretary on Tuesday, March 14, complete in every detail. One entry fee covers both Sectional and Final Tourneys.

Entertainment-Indiana University has contracted with the Board to entertain eight men (which must include the faculty manager) from each school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at $8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Thursday, March 16, and continue, if necessary, to 8 a. m. Sunday, March 19. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary. Traveling will be at the expense of the competing schools.

Admission Fee-The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and seventy five (75) cents for season tickets.

Warnings-Entries are due Tuesday, March 14, and cannot be changed afterwards. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana. All data must be given. The management, protests, and privileges will be governed according to the regulations pertaining to the Sectional Tourneys.

Prizes-Indiana University will award the winning school a shield or trophy, and each member of its team an individual trophy. No other prizes shall be awarded.

# I. H. S. A. A. BASKET BALL TOURNAMENT CONTRACT. 

Alexandria, Indiana, .-.......-.-- 1916

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

The following articles of agreement are subscribed to by the Board of Control of the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and Principal.


Section I
The dates of the Indiana Sectional High School Basket Ball Tourneys shall be Friday and Saturday, March 10 and 11, 1916.

Section II
The State High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the High School representative with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before Saturday, March 4.

## Section III

The High School representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of eight men, which shall include one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of $7 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Friday, March 10, and $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Sunday, March 12. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control.

Section IV
The High School representative shall provide tickets, door-men, ushers, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, basketballs, and all necessary equipment for the games. No prizes whatever are to be given.

## Section V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Tourney.

## Section VI

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the officials for the games not included in Section IV.

> Section VII

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single game tickets and one (\$1) dollar for the season tickets,

## SEction VIII

Ta High School representative shall pay to each Referee at the close of his work the sum of twenty-five (25) dollars. There will be two Referees assigned to each Tourney.

## Section IX

After all expenses, save those for travel of the competing teams, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained, and if such proves to be more than one hundred (100) dollars the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid by the High School Representative. If the amount of the balance above one hundred ( 100 ) dollars is not sufficient to pay all of the transportation expenses, this amount shall be distributed pro rata among the competing schools, the Center school not sharing in this distribution. If the amount above one hundred (100) dollars is more than sufficient to pay all of the transportation expenses, this amount shall belong to the High School conducting the Tourney. The one hundred (100) dollars referred to above shall belong to the High School representative.

## Section X

The High School under whose auspices the Tourney is held promises hearty co-operation with the State Board of Control and the State Board of Control promises as much to the High School conducting the Tourney.

## Section XI

The details of all Tourneys, such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

## Section XII

The State Board of Control shall manage all Tourneys, and the High Schools are to work under this direction.

## Section XIII

The High School representative shall send by telegram the name of the winning school to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana, as soon as the Tournament is completed. The High School representative shall also send to A. L. Trester on or before Wednesday, March 15, the complete scores of all games, as well as copies of the local papers having comments upon the Tourney. A complete and itemized statement of the receipts and disbursements shall be sent on or before this date. A check calling for $\$ 3.00$ to cover the printing of the Schedules shall be sent upon this date, too.

Trester, Permanent Secretary, agrees to pay for his services twenty-five (25) dollars and no more. The High School Principal holding the Tourney shall pay this amount to the official at the close of the Tourney.

## Section III.

 of Control and the competing teams to make the Tourney fair in every way. The I. H. S. A. A. agrees to arrange a schedule of hours, teams, floors, officials, etc., and this schedule must not be changed by any one save the I. H. S. A. A. Instructions for everyone will be on these schedules.

Section IV.
The I. H. S. A. A. will designate the place to work, with the assurance now that it will be as near to the official's home as thought best.

## Section V.

The I. H. S. A. A. will furnish two officials for each Tourney, who will work in alternate games.

## Section VI.

The I. H. S. A. A. agrees to furnish the official full details on March.-or sooner.

## Section VII.

Spalding's Official Basketball Rules for 1915-16 shall govern all games except the "dribble" and Spalding's Guide for 1914-15 shall govern here. These rules are to be enforced rigidly and fairly, thus eliminating roughness and unclean playing at all times.

## Section VIII.

This proposition must be signed by both parties and returned on or before to be binding.

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and U. H. Smith, representing Indiana University.

## Section I.

The dates of the Indiana High School Basketball Tourney shall be March 17 and 18 at Bloomington, Indiana, on the University floors.

## Section II.

The High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, shall furnish U. H. Smith with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams on or before Wednesday, March 15.

Section III.
U. H. Smith shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of 7 men each, together with one rubber and one faculty manager for each team, between the hours of 8 p . m. Thursday, March 16, and 8 a . m. Sunday, March 19.

## Section IV.

The Indiana University representative shall provide tickets, gate men, announcers, scorers, time keepers, judges, and necessary equipment for the Tourney. He shall further provide a suitable shield for the school winning the Tourney and badges for the individual members of the winning team.

## Section V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the University representative who shall issue them to the representatives of the Press, the University officials, and to the helping students. The men on the competing teams with one rubber and one faculty manager for each team shall be admitted free to the Tourney. The members of the Board of Control and the Permanent Secretary shall be furnished with official badges and reserved seats.

## Section VI.

The High School Board of Control shall choose the officials other than those mentioned in Section IV.

## Section VII.

## TRACK AND FIELD.

The number of dual, triangular, and other Track Meets increased materially this year and Baseball seemed to decline in popularity as a High School sport.

The State Meet was held under the auspices of Franklin College and was very successful. The elimination events in the morning removed most of the difficulties encountered in past meets. There were 55 schools represented and 329 boys were entered in the events. Twenty-two schools shared in the point-winning.

A straw vote taken of all of the members of the I. H. S. A. A. showed conclusively that they were in favor of having Sectional Track Meets simdiar to the Sectional and Final Basketball Tourneys. The Board did not think it advisable to use this plan this year, however, because many schools were members of sectional organizations holding meets for several years back.

It should be strongly urged that High School boys should not enter so many events as to injure their health now and in the future. It should also be urged that High School boys should not enter distance runs without being in proper training for the event. Some legislation is also needed concerning uniforms of the contestants. In too many cases trousers are too short and too thin. Then too the suits should be clean. High School track men as well as basketball men could easily wear more clothing without being impeded in any way. There is danger of modesty becoming a lost art in athletics,

# Thirteenth Annual I. H. S. A. A. Track and Field Meet 

## ANNOUNCEMENT.

The Thirteenth Annual Track and Field Meet of the Indiana High School Athletic Association will be held at Franklin College, Franklin, May 20, 1916. Entries for the Meet will close Wednesday, May 10 , and all schools desiring to participate in the Meet must become members of the association before that time. Elimination contests will begin in all events at $9: 30 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. The finals will come in the afternoon at 1:30.

Eligibility-Each contestant in this Meet must have previously made in a fair test a record equal to the following in every event in which he is entered:
100 Yard Dash ..... 11 s.
220 Yard Dash ..... 26 s.
440 Yard Dash ..... 58 s.
Half Mile Run ..... 2 min .20 s.
Mile Run ..... 5 min .15 s .
120 Yard High Hurdles, ..... 19 s.
220 Yard Low Hurdles ..... 29 s.
Running High Jump. ..... 5 ft .
Running Broad Jump ..... 19 ft .
Pole Vault. ..... 8 ft .9 in .
Putting Shot ( 12 lb .) ..... 36 ft .
Throwing Discus ..... 90 ft .

The above, together with a mile relay, will constitute the events of the Meet. Winning first place in any event counts five points; second place, three points; and third place, one point. Points in the relay will not be counted in determining the winning team. In case of a tie in any event the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

The order of events is as follows:
Track Events - 100 yard dash trial; 120-yard hurdle trial; 100 -yard dash final; one mile run; 440-yard run; 120-yard hurdle final; 220 -yard dash trial; 220-yard hurdle trial; 880-yard run; 220 -yard dash final; 220-yard hurdle final; relay.
Field Events-Discus; running high jump: shot put; pole vault; running broad jump.
Entries-The entries in each event are limited to three, and the contestants in each to two from any school; except in the relay race, in which entries will be limited to six, and the number placed in competition to four, each running one-fourth mile.

All schools, in order to enter the contests of the State Meet will be required to certify that all athletic contests in which they have taken part since becoming members of the Association have been conducted in accordance with the rules of the Indiana High School Athletic Association, and that all their contestants in such contests have been qualified according to 1 ules.

Principals will be required to certify in writing that the contestants from their respective schools have all qualified in every event in which they are entered in the State Meet. Each Principal must fill out entry blanks with the names of the contestants from his school, and all required data, and send to A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, on or before May 10, 1916. THESE REQUIREMENTS MUST BE STRICTLY COMPLIED WITH. Special blanks for this purpose are enclosed.

Elimination-In the elimination contests trials will be held in all events both track and field and no contestant will be permitted to participafe in the final contests who fails to qualify in the elimination contests.. Full details will be worked out as soon as the number of contestants in each event is known, and the scheme will give all contestants equal opportunities to qualify for the final contests.

Protests-All protests and complaints against members of the Association for violation of the rules must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before May 10. Protests as to the eligibility of individual contestants under the constitution are to be decided by the Board of Control, and may be filed with the Secretary at any time.

Management-The management of this meet rests solely with the Board of Control. The selection of officials to be approved by the Board, has been delegated to the athletic management of Franklin College. The referee and starter are to be chosen from A. A. U., in order that records made at the Meet may be recognized by that body. The Board will arrange programs for the forenoon and afternoon, assigning places on the track by lot and the printed program will indicate the order in which the men will be called upon the track. The rules governing the Meet correspond to those of the Western Inter-Collegiate Amateur Athletic Association, except where these have been modified by the Board of Control. These rules, as ad ppted by the Board, are printed in the I. H. S. A. A. Hand Book of Athletics and Annual Report of the Board of Control. Copies may be had of the Permanent Secretary for 10 c each, postpaid.

Prizes-No prizes will be awarded except a cup to the winning team, a pennant to the winning relay team, and badges for point winners. Admission will be twenty-five (25) cents in the forenoon and fifty (50) cents in the afternoon. Contestants, one rubber, and the faculty manager from each school will be admitted free.

Entertainment-Franklin College will furnish entertainment for each contestant, one rubber, and one faculty manager. Entertainment will
begin at 6 p. m. Friday, May 19, and will end at $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Sunday, May 21 . All teams must be accompanied by a Faculty Manager, who will be responsible for the conduct of the contestants.

Fees-A fee of one (1) dollar for each team must accompany the entries. This fee will be retained by the Board for expenses. Traveling is at the expense of the competing schools.

Warnings-Entries close Wednesday, May 10, and cannot be changed afterwards. An entry fee of one (1) dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank. Special privileges will be granted to no one. Send all entry blanks and money to A. L. Trester, Alexandria, Indiana. Use the official blank for entering. All data for each man must be given. All late entries will be returned.

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT.

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and John M. Thurber, representing Franklin College.

## Section I.

The date of the Indiana High School Track and Field Meet shall be May 13, 1916, at Franklin College, Franklin, Indiana, and shall be under the sole management of the I. H. S. A. A.

## Section II.

The High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish John M. Thurber with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before Monday, May 8, 1916.

## Section III.

John Thurber shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams, including one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of $8 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Friday, May 12, and 8 a . m. Sunday, May 14.

Section IV.
The Franklin College representative shall provide tickets, gate men, announcers, scorers, time-keepers, judges, and necessary equipment for the Meet. He shall further provide a suitable cup for the school winning the Meet, a pennant for the winning team, and badges for point winners. No other prizes shall be given by any one.

## Section V.

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the College representative who shall issue them to the representatives of the Press, officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team are to be admitted free to the Meet. The members of the Board of Control and the Permanent Secretary shall be furnished with official badges and reserved seats near the finishing line.

## Section VI.

The High School Board of Control shall sanction the choice of Referee and Starter, and the Head Field Judge. The Referee must be an A. A.U. man.

## Section VII.

The admission fee shall be fifty ( 50 ) cents to all in the afternoon and twenty-five (25) cents in the forenoon.

## Section VIII.

The College representative, John Thurber, shall pay one hundred (100) dollars to A. L. Trester of the High School Board of Control at the close of the Meet.

## Section IX.

A financial statement covering all receipts and expenditures of the Meet shall be sent to A. L. Trester by the College representative on or before Wednesday, May 17.

## Board of Control Meeting.

The Board met at 11:00 a. m., December 30, 1915, all members and the Permanent Secretary being present.

Dayton Fletcher and Woodard Auble of the Forest High School were declared ineligible to participate inBasket ball for this season for having played on an independent team.

A protested game of Basketball played between Portland and Winchester was declared a tie game.

George Myers, a student in the Bloomington High School, was suspended until January 20 for having played Football without having Parent's and Physician's Certificate.

The following cities were decided upon as centers for holding Sectional Basketball Tourneys on March 10 and 11: Anderson, Bedford, Bluffton, Crawfordsville, Franklin. Gary, Kokomo, Lafayette, Lebanon, Martinsville, Richmond, Rochester, Seymour, Terre Haute and Vincennes. The Permanent Secretary was instructed to get contracts with these Centers at once.

## Board of Control Meeting.

The Board of Control met at 6:00 p. m. February 19, 1916, in the Severin Hotel, Indianapolis. All members and the Permanent Secretary were present.

The Permanent Secretary was given authority to assign the officials for the Sectional and Final Tourneys.

Brazil High School was ordered to pay Clayton High School the expenses of entertainment for the Clayton team for one night which were occasioned by a game of Basketball at Brazil on February 15.

Winchester High School was ordered to pay $\$ 10.00$ forfeit money to Union City High School for failure to play a game of Basketball at Union City on January 28, as per contract. This money was ordered to be paid on or before March 1.

Roanoke High School was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1,1917 , for playing a game of Basketball with Bippus High School on

November 26 when the latter school was not a member of the State Association.

The Board refused to reinstate William Hoff of the Wiley High School, Terre Haute, who was disqualified recently for playing on an Independent team under an assumed name.

The official work of Arthur Rohm of Rockville was questioned by one High School Principal and the official was sustained by the Board.

Sheridan High School was ordered to pay Westfield High School on or before March 1 the sum of $\$ 10.00$ forfeit money for failure to play a game of Basketball at Westfield on January 21, as per contract.

The Board adjourned to meet at 6:00 p. m. March 4 at the Severin Hotel, Indianapolis.

## Board Meeting.

The Board met in the Claypool Hotel at 11 a. m. Saturday, April 1, 1916, all members and the Permanent Secretary being present.

The question of sectional track meets was discussed after going over the results of the straw vote returns from the Principals. It was decided to hold one open State Meet this year because of the fact that several organizations over the State had made all arrangements for meets. The Board desires to recommend sectional meets with a final one for next year, however. The straw vote showed a very decided opinion for such meets.

Bremen was ordered to pay Milford the expense money incurred in a Basketball game at Bremen on or before April 10.

The Basketball Tourneys were discussed and it was the opinion of the Board that a few tourneys should arrange for better management next year. Proper police measures were not taken at some places and at others some of the timers, scorers, etc., were unsatisfactory. The Board recommends closer officiating next year all over the State.

ANDERSON VS. CICERO. IN RE-OILING OF PLAYERS
The Board hereby censures the management of the Cicero team for using tactics meant to give advantage and which marred an otherwise satisfactory Tourney at Anderson. The Board does not sanction such methods and its stamp of disapproval is hereby placed on the conduct of the Cicero management and upon all such management in the future.

In the absence of any rule or precedent in the case the decision was free from a severer penalty.

The following ruling will govern all future cases of a similar nature and the Board offers no leniency whatever to any school. "No school shall at any time use any methods in any contest which are meant to be unfair and
which appear on the surface as being unsportsmanlike. The burden of proof here will be on the school violating the spirit of courtesy, friendliness, co-operation and clean athletics."

Invitational tourneys and meets held by Colleges and Universities were ruled out by the Board unless they were sanctioned by the Board. The Permanent Secretary was ordered to notify all the Colleges of the State regarding this matter.

## Board Meeting.

The Board re-authorized the Permanent Secretary to hire an office girl to handle all Athletic correspondence and to care for all of the details of the Association. The Permanent Secretary was authorized to pay this girl an amount necessary to secure an entirely competent and experienced secretary.

The Permanent Secretary was requested to ask the Chairman of the Executive Committee of the State Teacher's Association for a more favorable time and place to hold the State meeting of the I. H. S. A. A.

## Fourteenth Annual Meeting.

The fourteenth annual meeting of the I. H. S. A. A. was called to order by Pres. Jos. H. Shock at 9 a . m. October 27, 1916, in the auditorium of the Odd Fellow's Hall in Indianapolis.

The reading of the minutes was dispensed with since they were printed in the Hand Book last year. Badges were given to the representatives present and the regular order of business was taken up.

It was moved and passed that the Association consider amendments prior to the election of a Board member. Principal McElroy of Hammond, then presented the following amendments which were discussed and passed by sections:

1. The State shall be divided into five geographical districts according to membership.
2. Each district shall have one representative on the Board of Control who shall be elected by mail by the members of his district
3. A committee of five shall be appointed to arrange the details nectssitated by amendments 1 and 2 .

Principal Montgomery of Brazil presented the following and it was passed unanimously: The Permanent Secretary shall receive one hundred fifty dollars ( $\$ 150$ ) per year and he shall hire a competent secretary to do the clerical work of the Association.

Prin. Johnson of Rochester made the following motion which was passed: In sectional and final Basketball Tourneys each Principal may certify to ten men and shall be permitted to enter eight men only from this list.

Mr. Sollit of Indiana University and Mr. Cutts of Purdue University invited the Association to hold the next final Basketball Tourney at their schools, The vote stood 89 for Indiana and 44 for Purdue.

It was moved and passed that Spalding's Basketball Guide should govern in all particulars regarding basketball.

Principal Records of Terre Haute presented the following which were passed:

1. Rule Sixth under the heading of Interpretations shall be dropped.
2. The Basketball season shall begin with the school year and last through-out the school year.
3. Section 20 Page 72 shall be dropped.

The details of the State Track and Field Meet were left to the Board of Control.

The committee on the certification of officials was discharged and their report rejected in full.

Principal Ramsey moved and it was passed, that the discus shall be eliminated from the field events in all meets conducted under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Pres. Shock appointed the following men on a committee to report on the details of re-districting the State: Principals McElroy, Wagoner, Wiley, Beyers, Pickell, and by vote of the Association the Permanent Secretary was made a member of the committee.

The meeting adjourned to meet at 4 p. m. Friday, October 28, at Shortridge High School.

## Adjourned Annual Meeting.

The I. H. S. A. A. met in adjourned session at 4 p. m. October 28 , to receive the report of the committee on re-districting the State.

The following report was made and accepted:

1. The State shall be divided as follows by counties:
a. First District-Benton, Carroll, Cass, Fulton, Jasper, Lake, Laporte, Marshall, Newton, Porter, Pulaski, Starke, St. Joseph, Tippecanoe, White.
b. Second District-Adams, Allen, Blackiord, Dekalb, Elkhart, Grant, Howard, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Miami, Noble, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, Whitley.
c. Third District-Boone, Clay, Clinton, Fountain, Hamilton, Hendricks, Marion, Montgomery, Morgan, Owen, Parke, Putnam, Tipton, Vigo, Vermillion, Warren.
d. Fourth District-Bartholomew, Dearborn, Decatur, Delaware, Fayette, Franklin, Hancock, Henry, Jay, Jefferson, Jennings, Johnson, Madison, Ohio, Randolph, Ripley, Rush, Shelby, Switzerland, Union, Wayne.
e. Fifth District-Brown, Clark, Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Floyd, Gibson, Green, Harrison, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Martin, Monroe, Orange, Perry, Pike, Posey, Scott, Spencer, Sullivan, Vanderburg, Warrick, Washington.
2. Supt. Denny shall continue as the Board member from the Fourth District until January 1, 1918. Prin. Ramsey shall continue as the Board member from the Fifth District until January 1, 1919. A member shall be chosen to represent the First District until January following the next election; a member shall be chosed to represent the Second District for one year from January 1 following the next election and a member shall be chosen to represent the Third District for two years from January 1 following the next election.
3. Ballots shall be sent out by the Permanent Secretary by December 1 and all ballots shall be in his hands by December 10 .
4. After these initial elections each member shall be elected for three years.
5. All newly elected officers shall assume office January 1 following the time of election.
6. In case of vacancy on the Board the remaining members of the Board shall appoint a person from the district wherein the vacancy exists to serve until the next election only.
7. Removal from the district or withdrawal from the teaching profession constitutes a vacancy.
8. No retiring member of the Board, having served three years shall be eligible for re-election for a period of three years after date of retirement.
9. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
10. Each High School Principal whose school is a member of the I. H. S. A. A. on or before December 1, is entitled to one vote for a person to represent his district on the Board of Control.
11. The one receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected.
12. In case of a tie the vote shall be taken again, the votes being cast for the men who were tied.

The Board of Control was given authority to make such changes in the Rules of the Association as will make for uniformity concerning the time for the payment of dues, the end of the fiscal year, the beginning dates of the service of Board members, the time of future elections, etc.

A proposition presented by Mr. Jake Gimbel of Vincennes, to give a cash prize and a medal to the member of one of the teams at the Final Basketball Tourney who showed the best mental attitude during the tourney, was accepted.

The meeting adjourned to meet at 10:30 a. m. November 25 in the Claypool Hotel.

# Rules of the Indiana High School Athletic Association Regarding Track and Field Meets. 

## Based on the Rules of the Intercollegiate Conference

 Athletic Association.
## RULE I. <br> Officials.

Section 1. All meetings must be under the direction of The Board of Control.
One referee.
Two or more inspectors.
Three or more field judges.
Three judges at finish.
Three or more timekeepers.
One starter.
One clerk of the course.
One scorer.
One marshal.
Sec. 2. If deemed necessary, assistants may be provided for the clerk of the course, the scorer and the marshal, and an official announcer may be appointed.

## RULE II. The Board of Control.

The Board of Control shall have jurisdiction of all matters not assigned by these rules to the referee or other game officials.

## RULE III. <br> The Referee.

The referee must decide all questions relating to the actual conduct of the Meet, whose final settlement is not otherwise covered by these rules, and shall have the power to add to or alter the announced arrangements of heats in any event. A referee has no authority, after heats have been drawn and published in a program, to transfer a contestant from one heat to another.

When in any but the final heat of a race a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to culpable carelessness, and shall also have power to allow the hindered competitor to start in the next round of heats, just as if he had been placed in his trial.

When in a final heat a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to his carlessness or conduct, and he shall also have the power to order a new race between such of the competitors as he thinks entitled to such a privilege.

If during the athletic contest under the rules of the I. H.S. A. A. a competitor shall conduct himself in a manner unbecoming a gentleman or offensive to the officials, spectators or competitors, the ireferee shall have the power to disqualify him from further competition at the Meet; and if he thinks the offense worthy of additional punishment, must promptly make a detailed statement of the facts to the Board of Control.

Power to change the order of events as laid down in the official program is reserved to the Board of Control, which shall, through its chairman, exercise this authority, unless it sees fit to expressly delegate this power to the referee.

The referee shall not have authority to disqualify any competitor for violation of the eligibility rule of the I. H.S. A. A. All protests as to eligibility made on the field must be referred to the Board of Control, and the protested competitor must be allowed to compete until disqualified by the arbitrator of the I. H. S. A. A.

## RULE IV

## The Inspectors.

It shall be the duty of the inspector to stand at such point as the referee may designate, to watch the competition closely, and, in case of claim of foul, to report to the referee what he saw of the incident. Such inspectors are merely assistants to the referee, to whom they must report, and have no power to make any decision.

## RULE V. <br> The Judges of the Finish.

The judges of the finish must determine the order of finishing of contestants, and must arrange among themsclves as to noting the winner, second, third and fourth, etc., as the case may require, and there must always be two judges, whose duty must be to choose the winner.

Their decision in this respect must be without appeal, and in case of a disagreement a majority must govern.

## RULE VI. The Field Judges.

The field judges must make an accurate measurement and keep a tally of all trials of competitors in the high and broad jumps, the pole vaults, the weight competitions and the discus throws.

They must act as judges in these events, and their decisions must likewise be without appeal. In case of disagreement, a majority must govern. There must be at least three judges for every event.

## RULE VII.

## The Timekeepers.

The timekeepers must be three in number, and must individually time all events where time record is called for. At the conclusion of each heat, each timekeeper nust present his watch to the referee for inspection, and he must decide the official time. Should two of the three watches mark the same time and the third disagree, the time marked by said two watches must be accepted. Should all three disagree, the time marked by the intermediate watch must be accetped.

The flash of the pistol must denote the actual time of starting.
If, for any reason, only two watches are held on any event, and they fail to agree, the longer time of the two must be accepted.

## RULE VIII.

## The Starter.

The starter must have sole jurisdiction over the competitors after the clerk of the course has properly placed them in their position for the start.

The method of starting must be by pistol report, except that in time handicap races the word "go" must be used.

An actual start is not effected until the pistol has been purposely discharged after the competitors have been warned to get ready.

In case the pistol was not purposely discharged, the competitors shall be called back by the starter by pistol fire.

Note-The starter must have at least two good cartridges in his pistol before starting a heat.

When any part of the person of a competitor touches the ground in front of his mark before the signal is given, it must be considered a false start.

Penalties for false starling must be inflicted by the starter, as follows: In all races to and including 125 yards, the competitor must be put back one yard for the first and another yard for the second attempt; in races over 125 yards and including 300 yards, two yards for the first and two more for the second attempt; in races over 300 yards and including 600 yards, three yards for the first and three more for the second att $\in \mathrm{mpt}$; in races over 600 yards and including 1,000 yards, four yards for the first and four more for the sec-
ond attempt; in races over 1,000 yards and including one mile, five yards for the first and five more for the second attempt; in all races over one mile, ten yards for the first attempt and ten more for the second attempt.

In all cases, the third false start must prevent his competing in that event.
The starter must rule out of that event any competitor who attempts to advance himself from his mark, as perscribed in the official program, after he has been given the warning to "get ready."

## RULE IX.

## Clerk of the Course.

The clerk of the course must be provided with the names and tne numbers of all entered competitors, ard he must notify them to appear at the starting line before the start in each event in which they are entered.
RULE X.

## The Scorer.

The scorer must record the order in which each competitor finishes his event, sogether with the time furnished by the referee.

He must keep a tally of the laps made by each competitor in races covering inore than one lap, and must announce, by means of a bell or otherwise, when the leading man enters the last lap.

He must draw up a list of the actual competitors in each event, which shall be filed with the papers of the Association, and shall be the official record of competing entrants, and shall be final evidence in the enforcement of Rule III, of the rules of eligibility.

He must control his assistants and assign to them such of his duties as he may deem proper.

## RULE XI. <br> The Marshal.

The marshal must have police charge of the enclosure, and must prevent any but officers and actual competitors from entering or remaining therein.

He must control his assistants and assign to them their duties.

## RULE XII.

## The Official Announcer.

The official announcer must receive from the scorer and field judges the result of each event, and announce the same by voice or by means of a bulletin board.

## RULE XIII. <br> Competitors.

Competitors must report to the Clerk of the Course immediately upon their arrival at the place of meeting, and must be provided by that official with their proper numbers, which must be worn conspicuously by the competitors when competing, and without which they must not be allowed to start.

Each competitor must inform himself of the time of starting, and must be promptly at the starting point of each competition in which he is entered, and there report to the Clerk of the Course.

Under no condition shall attendants be allowed to accompany competitors at the start or during any competition.

## RULE XIV.

## Track Measurement.

All distances run or walked must be measured upon a line eighteen inches outward from the inner edge of the track, except that in races on straightaway tracks the distance must be measured in a direct line from the starting mark to the finishing line.

## RULE XV.

## The Course.

Each competitor must keep in his respective position from start to finish in all races on straightaway tracks, and in all races on tracks with one or more turns, he must not cross to the inner edge of the track, except when he is at least six feet in advance of his nearest competitor. After turning the last corner into the straight in any race, each competitor must run a straight course to the finish line, and must not cross to either the outside or inside from such straight course in front of his opponents.

In all races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

The referee must disqualify from that event any competitor who willfully pushes against, impedes, crosses the course of, or in any way interferes with another competitor.

The referee must disqualify from further participation in the Meet any contestant competing to lose, to coach, or in any way impede the chances of another competitor, either in a trial or a final contest.

## RULE XVI.

## The Finish.

The finish of the course must be represented by a line between two finishing posts, drawn across and at right angles to the sides of the track, and four feet above which line must be stretched a tape, attached at either end to the fiinishing posts. A finish must be counted when any part of the winners body, except his hands or arms, touches the tape at the finishing line. The tape must be considered the finishing line for the winners, but their order of finishing across the track line must determine the position of the other competitors.

## RULE XVII.

## Hurdles.

In the 120 yards hurdle race, ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be three feet six inches high. They must be placed ten yards apart, with the first hurdle fifteen yards distant from the starting point, and the last hurdle fifteen yards before the finishing line.

In the 220 yards hurdle race ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be two feet six inches high. They must be placed twenty yards apart, with the first hurdle twenty yards distant from the starting mark, and the last hurdle twenty yards before the finishing line.

In making a record it must be necessary for the competitor to jump every hurdle in its proper position.

In all hurdle races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have separate hurdles and a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

A competitor knocking down three or more hurdles, or any portion of three or more hurdles, in any race shall be disqualified.

## RULE XVIII.

## Jumping.

Section 1. A fair jump must be one that is made without the assistance of weights, diving, somersaults, or handsprings of any kind.

In scratch events competitors must jump in order as placed on program.
Sec. 2. The running high jump.-The field judges must decide the height at which the jumpshall commence, and must regulate the succeeding elevations.

Each competitor must be allowed three trial jumps at each height, and if on the third trial he shall fail, he must be declared out of the competition.

Competitors must jump in order, as provided in Section 1; then those failing, if any, must have their second trial jump in a like order, after which those who have failcd twice must make their third trial jump.

The jump must be made over a bar resting on pins projecting not more than three inches from the uprights, and when this bar is removed from its place by the competitor when trying, it must be counted as a trial jump.

Running under the bar in making an attempt to jump must be counted as a "balk," and three successive "balks," must be counted as a trial jump.

The distance of the run before the jump must be unlimited. A competitor may decline to jump at any height in his turn, and by so doing forfeits his rights to again• jump at the height declined.

Sec. 4. The running broad jump.- When jumped on earth, a joist five inches wide must be sunk flush with it. The outer edges of this joist must be called the scratch line, and the measurement of all jumps must be made
from it, at right angles, to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the person of the competitor.

In front of tiue scratch line the ground must be removed to the depth of three and the width of twelve inches outward.

A foul jump must be one where the cempetitor, in jumping (ff the scratch line, makes a mark on the ground immediately in front of it, or runs over the line without jumping, and must count as a trial jump without results.

Each Competitor must have three trial jumps, and the best three must have three more trial jumps.

The competition must be decided by the best of all the jumps of the competitors.

The distance of the run before the scratch line must be unlimited.
Sec. 5. The pole vault.- A pole must be furnished by the managing committee, but contestants may use their own private poles if they so desire, and no contestant shall be allowed to use any of these private poles except by the consent of their owners. The poles must be unlimited as to size and weight, but must have no assisting devices, except that they may be wrapped or covered with any substance (to obtain a firmer grip,) and may have one prong at the end.

No competitor shall, during the vault, raise the hand which was uppermost when he left the ground to a higher point of the pole, nor shall he raise the hand which was undermost when he left the ground to any point on the pole above the other hand.

The rules governing the runniug high jump must also govern the pole vault for height, except when the man leaves the ground in an attempt it shall be counted a trial.

## RULE XIX.

## Putting the Shot.

The shot must be a solid sphere, made of metal, and must weight twelve pounds.

It must be put with one hand, and in making the attempt it must be above, and not behind, the shoulder.

The competitor must stand in a circle seven feet in diameter. The cir cumference of the cirle must be divided into halves by a line drawn througn the center of the circle. On four feet of the front half of the circumference a board four inches high must be placed, the edge of which must be equally distant from the intersection of the line with the circumference, and at which the competitor must stand when the shot leaves his hand.

A fair put shall be one where no part of the person of the competitor touches in front of the circle, or on the board, in making the attempt,

A put must be counted as a foul if the competitor steps outside the circle on the board. A competitor must leave the circle by the rear half. Leaving by the front half must be declared a foul.

The measurement of all puts must be made from the nearest mark by the shot to a point on the circumference of the circle on a line with the object mark and the center of the circle.

Foul puts and letting go the shot in making an attempt must be counted as trial puts without results.

A board similar to the one in front may be used at the back of the circle.

The order of competing and the number of trials shall be the same as for the running broad jump. Shots must be furnished by the managing committee. Any contestant may use his own private shot, if correct in weight and shape; in which case the other contestants must be allowed to use it if they wish.

## RULE XXI. <br> Ties.

In case of a tie in any event, the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

## RULE XXII.

## Relay Racing.

1. A line must be drawn twenty feet in front of each starting line. Between these two lines each runner must touch the succeeding runner. Failure to do this disqualifies the team in that event. The judges must see that all touches are properly made.
2. The same rule with reference to fouls, coaching or impeding a runner in any way, apply to relay racing as to other events.
3. No member of a relay team can run back of the line, nor can one man run two relays in any team.
4. The positions of the team must be drawn for,

# Constitution of the Indiana High School 

# Athletic Association 

(Revised Nov. 15, 1916.)


## Administration

## Officers:

## Section 1. Board of Control.

a. The Board of Control shall consist of five members (principals, members of the faculty or superintendents) to represent the five districts into which the State is divided for administration purposes only.
b. Elections shall take place each year between December 1 and December 10 , all votes being mailed to the Permanent Secretary on ballots prepared by him.
c. Each member of the I. H. S. A. A. in a district shall have one vote for a Board member from his district.
d. Beginning with December 1916 members shall be elected as follows: First District, to serve until January 1, 1918; Second District, to serve until January 1, 1919; Third District, to serve until January 1, 1920. The Fourth District will have an election in December 1917, the member to serve three years and the Fifth District will have an election in December 1918, the member to serve three years.
e. After the initial elections each member shall be elected for three years.
f. All newly elected officers shall assume the duties of their offices on the first day of January next following his election.
g. The person receiving the highest number of votes in his district shall be elected.
h. In case of a tie the vote shall be taken again, the votes being cast for the men who are tied for first place.
i. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
j. Removal from the district or withdrawal from the teaching profession shall constitute a vacancy and in such cases the remaining members on the Board shall choose a person from the district wherein the vacancy exists to serve until the next election only.
k. No retiring member of the Board, having served three years, shall be eligible for re-election in any district for a period of one year after date of retirement.

## Sec. 2. I. H. S. A. A. Districts.

For the purposes of administration only the State shall be divided by Counties into the following districts:

First District-Benton, Carroll, Cass, Fulton, Jasper, Lake, Laporte, Marshall, Newton, Porter, Pulaski, Starke, St. Joseph, Tippecanoe, White.

Second District-Adams, Allen, Blackford, Dekalb, Elkhart, Grant, Howard, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Miami, Noble, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, Whitley.
Third District - Boone, Clay, Clinton, Fountain, Hamilton, Hendricks, Marion, Montgomery, Morgan, Owen, Parke, Putnam, Tipton, Vigo, Vermillion, Warren.
Fourth District-Bartholomew, Dearborn, Decatur, Delaware, Fayette, Franklin, Hancock, Henry, Jay, Jefferson, Jennings, Johnson, Madison, Ohio, Randolph, Ripley, Rush, Shelby, Switzerland, Union, Wayne.
Fifth District-Brown, Clark, Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Floyd, Gibson, Green, Harrison, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Martin, Monroe, Orange, Perry, Pike, Posey, Scott, Spencer, Sullivan, Vanderburg, Warrick, Washington.
Sec. 3. The Board of Control shall have the following powers and duties: (a) It shall have general control over all athletic contests between secondary schools in this Association; (b) It shall have exclusive control of the annual Inter-scholastic Meet; (c) It shall give interpretations of the rules of the Association; (d) It shall determine forfeitures under Sec. 11; (e) The Board of Control, at the end of any athletic season may, at its discretion, issue a statement of its official opinion as to the relative standing of teams. No school which has violated the rules of the Association in regard to the qualifications of players shall be awarded special honors in that particular branch of athletics.

Sec. 4. (a) When charges are made in writing by a member of the Association against another member for violation of the rules of the Association, the Board of Control, after giving due notice of the place and time for the school so charged to be heard, shall consider such charges, and may suspend the offending school for a period not exceeding one year. (b) The Board of Control shall decide upon all protests brought before it with reference to qualifications of contestants in the Inter-scholastic Meet. (c) When any matter comes before the Board for decision which is of special interest to a school of which a member of the Board is a representative, the remaining members shall appoint another person to act in his place in that matter-

Sec. 5. At the annual meeting of 1906 a Permanent Secretary shall be elected, who shall have charge of the property and records of the Association; shall receive all money for dues and the sale of publications of the Association; shall issue all circulars authorized by the Board of Control; shall attend meetings of the Board when requested to do so by the Board; shall turn over to the Treasurer of the Board all money in his possession when called upon to do so; shail perform such other duties as the growth of the Association as determined by the Board may require; and shall receive as compensation the sum of $\$ 150$ annually, and such allowances for expenses and clerical help as the Board may approve. Vacancies in the office may be declared by the Board for cause, and a successor appointed by the Board to act until the next annual meeting.

It shall be the duty of the Permanent Secretary to publish the I. H.S. A. A. year book immediately following the annual meeting of the Association.

## Local Management:

Sec. 6. The Principal or his authorized representative shall accompany his team to all contests.

Sec. 7. The principal of the school, or high school teachers authorized by him, shall be manager or managers of the teams representing the school.

Sec. 8. No games shall be played without the sanction of the principal.
Sec .9 . The eligibility of all the contestants shall be certified to by the principal of the school in accordance with the rules hereby adopted. Such statements shall be presented in writing within ten days before any contest. In case of disputes the principal must furnish the Board of Control the following data in regard to each contestant: The date of last enrollment; the number of years he has been a member of a secondary school athletic team; date and place of birth; average mark in each study for the last preceding term in school; average mark in each study from the beginning of the current term or semester. A school which does not furnish this data shall be denied championship honors, and may be excluded from the Annual Inter-scholastic meet.

Sec. 10. The principal has power and is advised to exclude any contestant who, because of bad habits or improper conduct, would not represent his school in a becoming manner.

Sec. 11. It is recommended that principals, in arranging for games, provide a forfeit of $\$ 10$, to be exacted should there be a failure on the part of either party to carry out the arrangements made. Should such forfeitures be stipulated and not be paid during the same season, the Board of Control, after hearing both sides, shall have authority to expel the delinquent school from the Association. Notification of such expulsion shall be published in the papers, with cause therefor.

Sec. 12. Paid Coaches, other than those regularly employed as teachers by the trustees of the school, are prohibited. By paid coach is meant any person who receives, directly or indirectly, remuneration of any kind, money, traveling expenses, gifts, etc., in return for services rendered in instructing or coaching any high school athletic team.

Sec. 13. Each school in the Association shall report to the Permanent Secretary a list of pupils representing the school in athletic contests during the year. Each school is asked to report also the kind of treatment accorded them to, from and on the field, while guests of another school.

## Officials:

Sec. 14. On and after January 1, 1910, all the Major Officials in all athletic contests participated in by teams connected with schools in the I. H. S. A. A. shall be regularly licensed teachers in the public schools of Indiana or shall be persons whose names have been furnished and approved by the Board of Control. It is recommended that these officials shall be disinterested, and it is required that when a school demands disinterested officials at the time of scheduling the game, such officials shall be furnished. The Board shall drop from its list of approved officials any person who is palpably unfair and biased in his decision in games.

Sec. 15. Non-playing student officials or assistants shall conform to the same rules as the players.

## Membership:

Sec. 16. Membership in this Association shall be limited to public High Schools of the state, and each school shall have one vote. The annual dues shall be $\$ 1.50$, payable when the school becomes a member, and thereafter by January 1 of each year, in advance.

Academies with commissioned high school standing shall be eligible to membership in the Association, and wherever the word "high school" appears in this Constitution it shall be understood to apply equally to these academies.

Beginning with the year 1914, and every year thereafter, the fiscal year of the Indiana High School Athletic Association shall close on December 31.

## Games and Game Rules:

Sec. 17. No games shall be played with high schools of this state not belonging to the Association.

This rule does not prevent a member of the Association from playing high school teams outside of the state, nor from playing non-high school teams within the state, except as follows:

It is a violation of the Constitution for schools in the Association to play non-high school teams including high school boys, unless the latter are certified as eligible by the Principal of the school to which they belong.

Sec. 18. The games recognized by the I. H. S. A. A. shall be: Football, Rugby Football, Soccer, Basketball, Track Work and Baseball. Further, all forms of inter-school athletic games shall be subject to the rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Sec. 19. In all football contests held under these rules, the length of each half shall be twenty-five minutes, unless changed by mutual consent.

Sec. 20. The basketball rules as published in Spalding's Official Basketball rule book, shall be the official rules governing all contests between members of the I. H. S. A. A. However, the rule governing the selection of officials in the above rules shall be void, and unless otherwise agreed by mutual consent, each school shall furnish one official, and these officials shall alternate their duties, each acting as referee and each acting as umpire one half.

## Rules.

## Eligibility.

Rule 1. To represent a school in any interscholastic contest, a person must be under twenty-one years of age; must have entered some public high school within the first twenty school days of the semester in which the contest occurs, and must be an amateur as defined by the A. A. U. Eighth grade pupils are not eligible. A semester is one-half of a school year.
(The term "Amateur" is defined and explained in Spalding's Official Handbook of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America.)

Rule 2. Any pupil who has been enrolled twenty (20) or more days from September 1 to December 1 of same year for each of four semesters will be ineligible to play football a fifth semester.
"Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from December 1 to March 1 of the next year for each of four
semesters shall be eligible to play a fifth semester, provided he meets the requirements of the other eligibility rules; provided further that no pupil shall represent his school longer than four years."

Interpretation-This rule applies only to students entering school for the first time during the second semester of the school year, and enrollment in school rather than participation in athletics shall determine the eligibility of all students.

Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from March 1 to June 1 of the same year for each of four semesters shall be ineligible to play baseball a fifth semester.

Interpretation-This section covers all branches of athletics.
Rule 3. A pupil withdrawing permanently from school within the first twenty school days of the semester shall not be regarded as having an opportunity to engage in athletics that semester unless he has already played in one or more interscholastic games, in which case he shall be regarded as having engaged in Athletics for that season.

Rule 4. Post Graduates are not eligible, but pupils graduating from regular three year courses shall not be deemed post graduates.

Rule 5. A student is a post graduate of a school after he has completed the work required for graduation by that school, irrespective of the time of granting the diploma.

Rule 6. Pupils meeting requirements for graduation in three and onehalf years in high schools with regular four year course shall be eligible to participate in school athletics the last half of the fourth year, provided they meet all other eligibility rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Rule 7. Time spent in athletic sport by pupils while in grades below the high school shall not be counted as part of the four years.

Rule 8. No person shall enter a contest under an assumed name.
Rule 9. Any memaber of a high school athletic team who participates in an athletic contest as a member of any other similar team the same season, shall be ineligible to compete under these rules for the remainder of that season.

An exception is hereby made for basketball and basketball players in those towns and cities whose schools have no gymnasium and whose students are forced by necessity to use a Y. M. C. A. or some other gymnasium for their practice games. It is a well known fact that the use of such gymnasium by high school students under such circumstances will likely require that such students play on the teams of the organizations
maintaining such gymnasiums. No student, however, will be permitted to play on any other team than that representing the organization controlling the gymnasium, and no student will be allowed to play in the teams of the latter without the knowledge and consent of his principal.

Rule 10. Each contestant must have and be maintaining for the current semester, a passing grade in each of three or more studies requiring a minimum of fifteen regular high school recitations per week, exclusive of rhetoricals, physical culture, military drill and deportment; in his last preceding semester in school he must also have met the same requirements throughout the entire term.

Pupils enrolled for the first time must comply with the requirements of the rules, the average standing required for the preceding semester being obtained from the records in the last secondary school attended.

Back work may be made up, providing that it is done in accordance with the regular rules of the school and becomes a matter of final record before the next semester.

Interpretation-In each of the studies representing the minimum requirement of work specified above: (a) For the current semester the average of the monthly grades up to the time of certification must be passing; (b) for the current or school month the average of the daily or weekly grades must be passing; (c) if the average of the monthly grades at the beginning of any month is below passing in any study, the pupil is ineligible as far as that study is concerned for the entire month.

Rule 11. No person who has been enrolled as a student in an institution of college standing, and has done work which may be counted toward a degree in that institution, shall be eligible as a member of any athletic team under I. H. S. A. A. rules in any game with any other team, either within or without the State of Indiana.

Rule 12. The eligibility rules of this Association shall apply to students taking part in all contests, whether with schools inside or outside the State of Indiana.

Rule 13. On and after January 1, 1911, no student shall be eligible to play football uuless he has been examined by a regular physician and his physical condition has been pronounced satisfactory. Further, such student shall not be eligible until the physician's certificate has been filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. Said certificate shall be good from September 1 to December 1, only.

Rule 14. On and after January 1, 1911, no pupil shall be eligible to play football without the written consent of his father, mother or guardian, Said written consent shall be attested by the Principal or Faculty Manager,
and shall be filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. The copy of said written consent shall be attached to the physician's certificate when filed with the Permanent Secretary.

## Interpretations.

First. A game is any athletic contest where an admission fee is charged, or where any collection or contribution is received from spectators.

Second. The football season is defined as beginning with the opening of school and closing with November 30.

Third. No student who violates the rules of the Association will be reinstated by the Board.

Fourth. A pupil who has played in one or more interscholastic games in any season shall be regarded as having engaged in athletics for that season.

Fifth. When a member or members of any team are protested, the game should be played as scheduled and the protest filed with the Board for settlement later.

Sixth. The basketball season is defined as lasting the entire school year.

Seventh. Pupils under twenty-one at the time of registration in school shall be so regarded until the time of their next registration.

Eighth. Any student, who carries at least 15 hours of regular High School work, is a High School student.

Ninth. It is recommended that Principals take proper measures to control the crowd and the players in all contests. Failure to do so shall be considered sufficient grounds for expulsion from the Association.

1. Parents and physician's certificates, contracts for all contests, eligibility certificates, blanks for certification of officials, and blanks for reporting contests will be furnished in quantities upon application to the Permanent Secretary. Please state definitely the kind and number of each wanted.
2. The Annual Handbook will be sent upon receipt of ten cents.
3. All correspondence und remittances from members of the Association to the Board of Control or to the Permanent Secretary must be indorsed by the principal or a member of the faculty.
