The IHSAA boys basketball semi-state previously scheduled to be hosted at Richmond High School on Saturday, March 21, 2015 has been moved to Southport High School. The 2A contest between Linton-Stockton and Park Tudor will tip off at 4 pm ET and will be followed by the 3A contest between Vincennes Lincoln and Guerin Catholic.

Due to the fact that Richmond had won the regional championship yesterday and was going to be assigned to the Seymour Semi-State where it will play Evansville Reitz, the school asked to be relieved from its hosting duties in order to follow its team.
