Softball State Championships in the Balance on Saturday

The hard-hitting, fast-paced action of the 32nd Annual IHSAA Softball State Finals will take place Saturday including one former state champion, one returning team from last year and three that are new to this stage of the tournament.

The first of the four games begin at 10:30 am ET originating from Ben Davis High School on Indianapolis' far west side.

The opening game at 10:30 am ET features Class A No. 5 Borden (20-2) and No. 7 Frontier (22-8). Both teams will make their initial state championship game appearance.

The Class 2A final at 1:30 pm ET calls for No. 2 Evansville Mater Dei (26-5) to face last year's state runner-up in No. 8 Boone Grove (25-2).

The 3A contest at 4:30 pm ET is a matchup of two first-time participants in No. 3 Kankakee Valley (29-5) and No. 5 Lebanon (26-1).

Two of the state's best programs will meet in the Class 4A showdown as No. 2 Penn (26-3) goes for its second state title against No. 6 Avon (25-5) to decide the big-school class.

All four games will be televised live by Fox Sports Indiana (FSI) and available as a live stream to those outside of the FSI coverage area at IHSAAtv.org. The broadcast team for the Class A and 2A games includes Greg Rakestraw, Rob Blackman and Jeremiah Johnson. The team calling the 3A and 4A games is Jerry Baker, David Cook and Johnson.

Lafayette's Frank VanderMay to be honored as State's Top Official

Frank VanderMay of Lafayette is the recipient of the 2016 Interscholastic Athletic Official Association Award for excellence in the sport of Softball. Frank will be honored in a special ceremony during Saturday's state finals.



The Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation with the National Federation of Interscholastic Officials Association, recognizes and honors an outstanding official in each of 11 sports during the school year.

Frank has been a licensed softball official for 20 years, during which he has officiated 18 sectionals, six regionals, three semi-states, and three state championships in 2005, 2009, and 2013. He is a member of the Western Officials Association, and is licensed to officiate track and field and cross country in addition to softball.

Frank attended high school at Lafayette Jefferson and went on to graduate with a BA in Business/Marketing from Indiana University in 1971. In addition to his involvement in athletics as a high school official, Frank established the umpire clinic for the Wea Township Baseball/Softball Association.

He and his wife, Pat, have been married for 43 years, and have one daughter, Jennifer (38).

- Borden defeated #4 Tecumseh 3-1 in Saturday's semi-state followed by a 4-3 victory over top-ranked defending state champion Hauser ending their 35-game winning streak. Riley Schindler's suicide squeeze with bases loaded in the top of the seventh produced the winning run.

- Team defeated #3 Indianapolis Scecina 3-1 in Saturday's semi-state before edging Eastern Hancock 3-2 in eight innings for its first semi-state title.
- Wildcats avenged one of its regular season losses by beating South Spencer 2-1 in the sectional opener.
- Ten of its regular season victories came by shutout.
