**MEDIA CREDENTIALS:** The 2016-17 IHSAA State Finals Media Credential issued previously for the girls golf and boys tennis state finals is good for admission. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: yahoo.com, aol.com, etc.) will not be accepted.

**NO CHILDREN, PLEASE:** With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

**MEDIA WILL-CALL:** Approved requests will be available for pickup at the will-call windows at the northwest corner stadium entrance beginning at 9:15 am ET.

**MEDIA PARKING:** While no specific media parking is available, we recommend using the Barnhill Garage just across New York Street to the north of the stadium. Each vehicle will be charged \$6.00 to park all day. Credit Cards ONLY will be accepted.

**SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:** Except where permanent lines have been installed for those that have ordered them, an open seating policy will be used in the press box.

**WIRELESS INTERNET:** Free wireless access will be available in the press box. Please see Communications Assistant Rob Kimes who will be on site to assist you.

**OFFICIAL PROGRAMS/BOX SCORES:** Official programs will be available along with computer box scores following each championship match. Interviews may be conducted with players and coaches on the sidelines following the award ceremonies.

**BOB SNOOK OF FLOYDS KNOBS  
TO BE HONORED WITH  
OUTSTANDING OFFICIALS AWARD**

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association honors an outstanding official in each sport during the State Final Tournament.

Bob Snook, of Floyds Knobs, is the recipient of the 2016-17 IHSAA Outstanding Soccer Official in the state of Indiana. As a member of the South Central Officials Association, Bob has been a licensed soccer official for the past 23 years where he has served as the Soccer Chairperson for many years. In addition to his Association responsibilities, Bob has been instrumental in the training of IHSAA soccer officials.



He serves as one of the IHSAA's most highly respected clinicians. His dedication and loyalty to his sport, our student athletes, his fellow officials, and to the IHSAA have been exceptional.

Bob was selected for this honor by a committee representing the official's associations. In Indiana there are 24 associations made up of more than 7,000 men and women who give up much of their personal time to assist in providing wholesome, worthwhile, and healthy activities for the student-athletes in our state. State-wide, there are more than 8,000 officials licensed by the IHSAA in 11 sports.

During his career, Bob has worked 18 IHSAA Sectional Soccer tournaments. He has been a part of 11 different Regional crews, five (5) Semi State crews, and four (4) State Final crews, to include his state appearance here at IUPUI in 2014.

# CLASS A BOYS STATE CHAMPIONSHIP NOTABLES

## PROVIDENCE PIONEERS (18-2-1)

### Soccer Coaches Poll: #2

- Providence playing in second state championship match in four years and looking for school's first boys soccer title.
- Nine starters return from last year's 13-5-3 team.
- With a victory on Saturday, would become seventh school with soccer state championships in both genders joining Carmel, Evansville Memorial, Fort Wayne Canterbury, Mishawaka Marian, North Central (Indianapolis) and South Bend St. Joseph.
- Pioneers knocked off top-ranked Lawrenceburg 2-0 in the regional semifinal match at Switzerland County and also topped #9 Evansville Mater Dei 4-0 in the semi-state.
- Providence has shut out all six tournament opponents and not allowed a goal since Sept. 13, a span of 10 matches. They've outscored opponents 50-0 during that stretch.
- Team captured its fifth consecutive sectional championship this season and fourth regional crown in five years.
- Seniors Eli Coker and Braden Rainier rank among the state leaders with 74 points (31 goals, 12 assists) and 53 points (23 goals, 7 assists), respectively. Cokers 31 goals ranks 12th in the state and Rainier's 23 are 26th-best. Senior Kevin Chrisco is 10th in the state in assists with 18 this season. Sophomore Isaac Coker had added 14.
- Coach Nathan Marshall, a 2009 Providence graduate, is in his first season as a head coach.
- School is enjoying a run of athletic success having won all five of its state championships since 2011. The volleyball team is a three-time defending state champion while the Pioneer baseball team won the 2A crown last June.

### Soccer Coaches Poll: #5

- Marian boys soccer team returns to defend last year's crown and will be making third state finals appearance overall (2008).
- Six starters return from last year's state championship squad that finished 20-2.
- Last year, Knights became sixth school with soccer state championships in both genders joining Carmel, Evansville Memorial, Fort Wayne Canterbury, North Central (Indianapolis) and South Bend St. Joseph.
- Knights defeated a pair of ranked foes at the semi-state including a 3-0 win over #7 Westview followed by a 4-1 win over #20 Heritage Christian in the title match.
- Team captured fourth consecutive sectional with a 5-0 win over Bethany Christian on Oct. 8.
- Senior Cristian Juarez's 15 assists this season ranks 15th in the state. Freshman goalkeeper Hunter Renner's 0.9 Goals Against Average ranks 20th in the state.

## LAWRENCEBURG TIGERS (13-5-3)

### Soccer Coaches Poll: #10

- Lawrenceburg making its first-ever appearance in the soccer state finals and riding a 11-game unbeaten streak.
- School aiming for its third state championship in school history and first since the 1978 Tiger football team claimed the Class A title. The only other Lawrenceburg team to play in the state finals was the 2003 baseball team which fell in the state semifinals under the previous four-team Friday-Saturday format.
- Tigers captured their first semi-state championship this season after five previous trips to that round of the tournament.
- Team defeated a pair of ranked opponents at the semi-state last Saturday including a 5-0 win over #20 Indianapolis Cardinal Ritter and a win over #3 Heritage Christian decided in penalty kicks.
- Lawrenceburg returned six starters from last season's regional championship squad that finished 15-6.
- Tigers finished third in the Eastern Indiana Athletic Conference standings with a 5-2 record.
- Senior Holly Nutley ranks among the state's best with 11 assists this season.

- Andrean competing in the girls soccer state finals for the second time and first time since its 1999 state runner-up season.
- Team knocked out three ranked teams during its state tournament run - a 5-4 decision over #12 Wheeler in penalty kicks in the sectional final, a 5-0 win over #16 Westview in the semi-state semifinal followed by a 2-0 victory over #5 Belmont in the final.
- The 59ers returned eight starters from last season's regional championship team that finished 16-4.
- Team placed second in the Northwest Crossroads Conference this season with a 4-2 record.

## EVANSVILLE MEMORIAL TIGERS (18-4-1)

### Soccer Coaches Poll: #9

- Evansville Memorial making its eighth state finals appearance which ties for second-most in state history.
- Tiger soccer teams are 2-0 in state championship matches (2007, 2008) including a 1-0 win over Chesterton in the 2007 final.
- Team avenged one of its regular season losses by defeating Castle 2-1 on Oct. 8 for its 13th consecutive sectional championship. The 13-year streak is the third-longest active string in the state.
- Memorial topped a pair of ranked foes during the state tournament including a 2-0 win over #11 Jasper in the sectional opener and a win over #6 Bloomington South decided on penalty kicks.
- One of six schools in the state that have won championships in both genders along with Carmel, Fort Wayne Canterbury, Mishawaka Marian, North Central (Indianapolis) and South Bend St. Joseph.
- Junior Andrew Cross ranks fourth in the state with 35 goals and seventh with 20 assists. Senior Sam Bonano ranks 13th in the state with 31 goals and fourth with 25 assists. Cross and Bonano also rank fifth (90) and seventh (87) in points, respectively.
- Finished second in the Southern Indiana Athletic Conference this season with a 6-1 record.
- With a victory, coach Bill Vieth would become just the third coach in state history with three or more state championships joining North Central's Jerry Little and Fort Wayne Canterbury's Greg Mauch with five each.
