**NO CHILDREN, PLEASE:** With the exception of high school students representing their school's newspaper, yearbook, radio or television station, and who have a team participating, no young people or children will be issued media credentials or be allowed in the working media area.

**MEDIA WILL-CALL:** Approved requests will be available for pickup at the ticket windows located in the building at the northwest corner of the stadium beginning at 4:45 pm on Friday and at 9:45 am ET on Saturday.

**SEAT ASSIGNMENTS:** An open seating policy will be used in both press boxes.

The recipient of the 2019-20 IHSAA Outstanding Soccer Official in the state of Indiana is Mr. Heinz A. Pedolzky of Floyd Knobs.

Mr. Pedolzky was selected for this honor

by a committee representing the 24 officials Associations in Indiana.

Heinz went through his youth educational years in Germany. Heinz has been a licensed soccer official in Indiana for more than 25 years. In addition to his South Central Official Association responsibilities, Heinz has been instrumental in the recruitment, mentoring, and training of IHSAA soccer officials. ### Soccer Coaches Poll: #1

- Top-ranked Lafayette Central Catholic making school's first appearance in the girls soccer state finals on Friday.
- All four Class A teams are making their first appearance in the soccer state finals this weekend.
- Team riding 22-match winning streak. Last loss was a 7-2 setback to 3A Harrison (West Lafayette) on Sept. 18.
- Sophomore Karsyn Cherry ranks among the state leaders with 84 points (Goals x 2 + Assists). Cherry and junior Caroline Lutz also rank among state leaders with 20 assists each.

### Soccer Coaches Poll: #17

- Indianapolis Lutheran playing in school's first soccer state championship match.
- All four Class A teams are making their first appearance in the soccer state finals this weekend.
- School hoping to score second state championship in four and a half months after softball team scored the Class A crown last June in West Lafayette.
- Defeated three ranked teams during state tournament - #18 Central Christian 1-0 for sectional title, #1 Greenwood Christian 2-0 for regional crown, and #9 Jac-Cen-Del 1-0 for semi-state championship. Saints' victory over Greenwood Christian avenged a 1-0 defeat in the regular season finale.
